

Child Abuse & Neglect Prevention Board

- Created by Act 397 of 1987
- 9 Member Governor Appointed Board
- Oversee distribution of funds from the Children's Trust Fund
- · Promote primary prevention activities

Children's Trust Fund

- \$10 Surcharge on the Marriage License Fee
- 80% Expended on Grants and Administration
- 20% Remains in Trust until \$10 Million
- Funds dispersed to <u>Prevention Programs</u>
 via a competitive grant making process.

County Local Councils

- Composition:
 - DHS / DCFS Representative
 - · Div. Of Health Representative
 - · Local Education Representative
 - · Local Law Enforcement Representative
 - · Citizen At-Large
- Review and approve all applications from their county

Community Based Grants

- · RFP issued annually
- · 2 year awards
- Average \$20,000 \$40,000
- 12 15 Grants per year
- Strictly Primary Prevention: BEFORE ABUSE OCCURS!

- · Curriculum Trainings
- Networking Days

Findings Exhibit A

One Percent to Prevent Fund

- To serve children of incarcerated parents and their caregivers
- \$200,000 from General Improvement Fund FY 04-05 Biennium
- Used as match for Federal grant and established mentoring programs across the state

Strengthening Families Initiative

- · Partnering with DCCECC
- AR is 1 of 7 pilot states
- · Encourage child care providers to support and assist parents
- Child care providers as a gateway to services
- Early warning system
- Incorporate into Quality Rating System

STAR TEAM Newborn Home Visiting Initiative

- 5 year, Federally funded project to promote the establishment of newborn home visiting programs in AR
- · Healthy Connections in Mena and Centers For Youth & Families in Little Rock
- CTF approved 2 new programs at \$90,000 each
