Risks to the Child Victims:

Immediate disability from physical injury, pregnancy, sexually transmitted diseases, psychological trauma......

Long-term disability from delays in normal development, handicaps after physical injury, sexually transmitted diseases, mental health disorders......

Socio-behavioral problems such as delinquency, criminality, substance abuse, interpersonal violence, high risk sexual behavior, teen pregnancy, perpetrating abuse.....

Adult Health Problems ARE Linked to Adverse Childhood Experiences:

People who experience 4 or more "adverse childhood experiences" have:

- 1. 4-12 times increase in health risks of alcoholism, drug abuse, depression, and suicide attempts.
- 2. 2-4 times increase in smoking, poor self-rated health, having sexually transmitted diseases and more than 50 sexual partners.
- 3. 1.5 times increase in physical inactivity and obesity.

Costs to the system:

Short-term:

1. Children hospitalized with a diagnosis of child abuse/neglect average \$10,000 more per hospitalization, have twice the number of co-morbidities, are 9 times as likely to die during hospitalization, and are more likely to be covered by state Medicaid coverage compared to other hospitalized children.

2. Newborns born to mothers who use illegal drugs during pregnancy stay an average of 7 days longer at a cost of \$7,731 more than infants not exposed to drugs.

<u>Direct costs</u> of hospitalization, chronic health problems, mental health care treatment, child welfare expenses, law enforcement, judicial = \$24.4 Billion
 <u>Indirect costs</u> of special education needs, mental and health care of victims as adults, juvenile delinquency, lost production to society, adult criminality = \$69.7 Billion
 Total costs to U.S. in 2001 = \$94.1 Billion
