Rep. Roebuck-Chair, called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. and introduced Governor Mike Beebe.

Governor Beebe acknowledged and thanked the Arkansas General Assembly for its hard work. The Governor encouraged all present to continue working on education in Arkansas. He spoke about the results of an obvious disconnect in Arkansas as it relates to the number of students entering college and the number of bachelors degrees completed. Approximately 62% of Arkansas's high school graduates are attending college but Arkansas ranks 49th in the nation in the number of bachelors degrees. Somewhere along the line the obstacles are insurmountable and students are quitting before complete success. Governor Beebe charged the attendees to provide a road map for how to improve the statistics.

Rep. Roebuck introduced Kati Haycock and she made her presentation.

## Ms. Kati Haycock, Director, The Education Trust

Ms. Haycock's topic was College Access and Success: Where are we? What do we need to do? She stated that a lot of progress has been made in the last 25 years on the access side for all ethnic groups.

She went on to explain that the gap in achievement remains. Ms. Haycock gave national information on the achievement gap and also state level information particular to Arkansas. There was a lengthy question and answer session following the presentation.
