What is Arkansas Doing to Close the Achievement Gap?

Clinton School professor of education policy **Dr. Keith Nitta** and Hendrix College professor of politics **Dr. Jay Barth** will present a report on the state of Arkansas public education in the post-*Lake View* era. "What is Arkansas Doing to Close the Achievement Gap?" assesses whether reforms Arkansas has adopted are likely to close the achievement gap between economically advantaged and disadvantaged students and between white and minority children in the state.
