HOUSE BILL 1145

"AN ACT TO ESTABLISH THE SALARY AND EXPENSE ALLOWANCE OF THE
DEPUTY PROSECUTING ATTORNEY FOR PHILLIPS COUNTY; AND FOR
OTHER PURPOSES."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

SECTION 1. The annual salary of the deputy prosecuting attorney in Phillips County shall be not less than \$21,000.00 nor more than \$24,000.00 as prescribed by the Quorum Court of Phillips County. The salary shall be payable in equal monthly installments from the County General Fund of Phillips County. In addition to the salary herein provided the deputy prosecuting attorney shall receive a secretarial, office and travel expense allowance not to exceed \$200.00 per month.

SECTION 2. The provisions of this Act shall be retroactive to January 1, 1987.

SECTION 3. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are hereby repealed.

SECTION 4. It is hereby found and determined by the General Assembly that the minimum and maximum salary for the Phillips County Deputy Prosecuting Attorney is inadequate; that the salary may not be increased until authorized by the General Assembly; that such authorization should take effect as soon as possible; that this Act provides for an increase in the salary and will not become effective until ninety days after the adjournment of the General Assembly unless this emergency clause is adopted. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in full force and

effect from and after its passage and approval.
