

SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

COMMENDING ARKANSAS' 76 CONSERVATION DISTRICTS FOR
DEDICATED STEWARDSHIP OF THE NATURAL RESOURCES OF
THE STATE, ESSENTIAL TO THE HEALTH AND WELL-BEING
OF THE CITIZENS OF ARKANSAS AND THE WORLD.

WHEREAS, the Arkansas General Assembly of 1937 passed the Nation's first
Conservation District Law, act 197 of 1937; and

WHEREAS, the State's Natural Resources are basic to the "Natural Image"
identity Arkansas has nurtured; and

WHEREAS, Conservation Districts have served the State's people and
resources with unsurpassed dedication for the past fifty years; and

WHEREAS, that resource is basic to the health and economy of the State
and its people; and

WHEREAS, Conservation Districts and their Directors are deserving of
public commendation and appreciation;

NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE REGULAR SESSION OF THE SEVENTY-SIXTH
GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CON-
CURRING THEREIN:

THAT the Seventy-Sixth General Assembly and the individual members of the
Assembly hereby express sincere appreciation of Arkansas Conservation
Districts for their outstanding contributions to the future of the State and
Nation and to the well-being of the people, and commend them for their dedica-
tion to the wise utilization of our Natural Resources; and

THAT the week of May 24 -- 31, 1987 is hereby designated and recognized
as "Soil Stewardship Week" in Arkansas.
