

SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

PROVIDING FOR SUSPENSION OF THE JOINT RULES OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES AND SENATE TO PERMIT THE INTRODUCTION OF A BILL RECOMMENDED BY THE SPECIAL JOINT COMMITTEE ESTABLISHED TO STUDY THE PRIVILEGES AFFORDED A PERSON WHO PURCHASES A HUNTING OR FISHING LICENSE FROM THE ARKANSAS GAME AND FISH COMMISSION.

WHEREAS, the President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives appointed a Special Joint Committee to Study the Privileges Afforded a Person Who Purchases a Hunting or Fishing License from the Arkansas Game and Fish Commission; and

WHEREAS, said Committee has completed its study and has recommended the adoption by the Senate and House of a Bill to establish the maximum annual resident hunting and fishing license fees that may be charged by the Arkansas Game and Fish Commission, as required under the provisions of Amendment No. 35 to the Arkansas Constitution;

NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE REGULAR SESSION OF THE SEVENTY-SIXTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY, AND BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, TWO-THIRDS OF THE MEMBERS ELECTED TO EACH HOUSE AGREEING THERETO:

THAT the Joint Rules of the House and Senate are hereby suspended for the purpose of authorizing the introduction and consideration of a Bill recommended by the Special Joint Committee Established to Study the Privileges Afforded a Person Who Purchases a Hunting or Fishing License from the Arkansas Game and Fish Commission, which proposes to establish the maximum annual resident hunting and fishing license fees that may be charged residents of this State by the Arkansas Game and Fish Commission.
