

SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION
PROVIDING FOR THE CONTINUATION OF THE SPECIAL JOINT
COMMITTEE ESTABLISHED TO REVIEW THE RESIDENT HUNTING
AND FISHING LICENSE FEES TO BE CHARGED BY THE GAME
AND FISH COMMISSION.

WHEREAS, the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President Pro Tempore of the Senate established a special joint Committee to study the privileges afforded a person who purchases a hunting or fishing license from the Arkansas Game and Fish Commission, and said Committee has submitted recommendations to the regular session of the Seventy-Sixth General Assembly proposing the establishment of the maximum annual resident hunting and fishing license fees that may be charged by the Game and Fish Commission; and

WHEREAS, Amendment No. 35 to the Arkansas Constitution provides that the General Assembly shall establish the maximum annual resident hunting and fishing license fees, and it is important that the special Committee be authorized to continue to review the action of the Game and Fish Commission in implementing the provisions of such legislation;

NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE REGULAR SESSION OF THE SEVENTY-SIXTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN:

THAT the special joint Committee established by the Speaker and the President Pro Tempore to study the privileges afforded a person who purchases a hunting or fishing license from the Arkansas Game and Fish Commission is hereby authorized to function following the adjournment of the regular session of the Seventy-Sixth General Assembly, for the purpose of monitoring the implementation of legislation enacted by the Seventy-Sixth General Assembly with respect to the establishment of maximum resident hunting and fishing license fees.

The members of said Committee shall function without pay, and may meet upon call by its Cochairmen or upon written request of a majority of the members of said Committee.
