HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE GOVERNOR TO IMMEDIATELY CREATE A TASK FORCE TO IDENTIFY ALTERNATIVES TO THE CENTRAL INTERSTATE LOW LEVEL RADIOACTIVE WASTE COMPACT FOR THE MANAGEMENT AND DISPOSAL OF ARKANSAS' LOW LEVEL RADIOACTIVE WASTE.

WHEREAS, the Central Interstate Low Level Radioactive Waste Compact was established to manage and dispose of the low level radioactive waste for the five states which are members of the Company; and

WHEREAS, the manner in which the Central Interstate Low Level Radioactive Waste Compact Commission has operated has resulted in resistance by each member state; and

WHEREAS, it appears that the Compact is not going to result in a viable method of managing and disposing of our low level radioactive waste; and

WHEREAS, this situation makes it imperative that Arkansas identify methods of disposing of its own low level radioactive waste without reliance upon the Compact; and

WHEREAS, this can most expeditiously be accomplished by the Governor creating a special task force to deal with the problem.

NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE FIRST EXTRAORDINARY SESSION OF THE SEVENTY-SIXTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:

That Governor Bill Clinton is hereby requested to immediately
