For An Act To Be Entitled

"AN ACT TO REPEAL CERTAIN PROVISIONS OF THE ARKANSAS CODE OF 1987 WHICH MAY IMPEDE THE PROVISION OF QUALITY EDUCATION TO ALL ARKANSAS STUDENTS; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

SECTION 1. Arkansas Code 6-10-105, 6-13-109, 6-13-223, 6-13-503, 6-13-615, 6-13-616, 6-17-303, 6-18-301, 6-18-302, 6-18-303, 6-18-304, 6-18-305, 6-18-308, 6-18-309, 6-18-310, 6-18-401 and 6-21-102 are hereby repealed.

SECTION 2. Arkansas Code 6-18-306(a), (b), (c), (d), and (e) are hereby repealed. Arkansas Code 6-18-306(f), and (g) are hereby recodified as new subsections (f) and (g) of Arkansas Code 6-18-316.

SECTION 3. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

SECTION 4. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are hereby repealed.

SECTION 5. It is hereby found and determined by the General Assembly that certain Arkansas Code provisions which have their roots in the segregative practices of the 1950s, are still in effect and may be impeding the state's efforts to rid itself of all vestiges of segregation. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval.
