HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

COMMENDING ARKANSAS FARMERS FOR THEIR MANY ESSENTIAL CONTRIBUTIONS TO A STABLE AND WELL BALANCED ECONOMY IN THE STATE, THE NATION AND THE WORLD, AND FOR PRODUCING THE FOOD AND FIBER THAT IS ESSENTIAL TO THE HEALTH AND WELL-BEING OF THE CITIZENS OF THIS STATE AND PEOPLE THROUGHOUT THE WORLD.

WHEREAS, the economy of the State of Arkansas is based largely upon agriculture and related activities and industries; and

WHEREAS, the farmers of the State not only produce the food and fiber that is essential to the health and well-being of the citizens of this State and people throughout the world, they also provide a source of employment for a large percentage of the residents of this State; and

WHEREAS, agricultural pursuits in the State produce annual wealth in excess of three billion dollars and contribute immeasurably to the stable and well balanced economy of the State; and

WHEREAS, many farmers in the State continue to pursue their agricultural endeavors in spite of nominal personal benefits derived from such activities in recent years; and

WHEREAS, a substantial portion of the State's revenues which are necessary to finance essential State and local programs and services are derived from agricultural and related activities; and

WHEREAS, Arkansas farmers are deserving of public commendation and appreciation,
