HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

FOR AN EXTENSION OF THE REGULAR SESSION OF THE
SEVENTY-SEVENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY TO ENABLE THE GENERAL
ASSEMBLY TO COMPLETE THE BUSINESS OF THE SESSION.

WHEREAS, Section 17 of Article V of the Constitution of the state of Arkansas provides that the regular biennial session of the General Assembly shall not exceed sixty days in duration, unless by a vote of two-thirds of the members elected to each house of the General Assembly; and

WHEREAS, it now appears that the regular session of the Seventy-Seventh General Assembly will be unable to complete the essential business of this session within sixty days, and that an extension of this regular session will be necessary for the completion of the business of this session,

NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE SEVENTY-SEVENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:

SECTION 1. The regular session of the Seventy-Seventh General Assembly of the state of Arkansas is hereby extended through the close of business in each house on April 3, 1989.

SECTION 2. The Seventy-Seventh General Assembly shall recess at the close of business on March 17, 1989, to reconvene at 12:00 noon on Monday, April 3 unless the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President Pro Tem of the Senate shall, by joint proclamation, determine that reconvening of the Seventy-Seventh General Assembly is unnecessary, in which event any five members of each house may adjourn the Seventy-Seventh General Assembly sine die.
