HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION

ASKING THE CONGRESS OF THE UNITED STATES TO PROPOSE AN AMENDMENT TO THE UNITED STATES CONSTITUTION TO ABOLISH THE ELECTORAL COLLEGE AND PROVIDE FOR THE ELECTION OF THE PRESIDENT AND VICE-PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES BY POPULAR VOTE.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE SEVENTY-SEVENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS AND THE SENATE, A MAJORITY OF ALL MEMBERS ELECTED TO EACH HOUSE AGREEING THERETO:

That the Congress of the United States is hereby requested to propose an amendment to the Constitution of the United States abolishing the Electoral College and providing for the election of the presidential and vice-presidential candidates who receive the highest total of the popular vote of the people.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that upon the adoption of this Resolution copies be transmitted to each member of Arkansas' Congressional Delegation.
