HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE JOINT INTERIM COMMITTEE ON AGRICULTURE AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT TO STUDY THE OPERATION OF THE VARIOUS REGULATORY BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS OF THIS STATE TO DETERMINE THE NUMBER OF JOBS LOST AS A RESULT OF OVER-REGULATION, AND TO STUDY THE NEED OF PROPOSING A CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT TO ALLOW MEMBERS OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY TO SERVE ON REGULATORY BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE SEVENTY-SEVENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

That the Joint Interim Committee on Agriculture and Economic Development is hereby requested to conduct a study of the operation of the various regulatory boards and commissions of this State to determine how many jobs are being lost as a result of over-regulation by the boards and commissions.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Joint Interim Committee on Agriculture and Economic Development conduct a study to determine the desirability of proposing an amendment to the Arkansas Constitution which would allow members of the General Assembly to serve on regulatory boards and commissions.
