SENATE BILL 296

"AN ACT TO MAKE AN APPROPRIATION FOR PERSONAL SERVICES AND OPERATING EXPENSES OF THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES - DIVISION OF ECONOMIC AND MEDICAL SERVICES FOR THE BIENNIAL PERIOD ENDING JUNE 30, 1991; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES - OPERATIONS. There is hereby established for the Department of Human Services - Division of Economic and Medical Services for the 1989-91 biennium, the following maximum number of regular employees whose salaries shall be governed by the provisions of the Uniform Classification and Compensation Act, or its successor, and all laws amendatory thereto. Provided, however, that any position to which a specific maximum annual salary is set out herein in dollars, shall be exempt from the provisions of said Uniform Classification and Compensation Act. All persons occupying positions authorized herein are hereby governed by the provisions of the Regular Salaries Procedures and Restrictions Act, or its successor.

SECTION 2. EXTRA HELP. There is hereby authorized, for the Department of Human Services - Division of Economic and Medical Services for the 1989-91 biennium, the following maximum number of part-time or temporary employees, to be known as "Extra Help", payable from funds appropriated herein for such purposes: Thirteen (13) temporary or part-time employees, when needed, at rates of pay not to exceed those provided in the Uniform Classification and Compensation Act, or its successor, for the appropriate classification.

SECTION 3. APPROPRIATIONS - OPERATIONS. There is hereby appropriated, to the Department of Human Services - Division of Economic and Medical Services, to be payable from the Department of Human Services Paying Account as designated by the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, for personal services and operating expenses of the Department of Human Services - Division of Economic and Medical Services for the biennial period ending June 30, 1991, the following:

SECTION 9. The Director of the Department of Human Services is authorized to transfer from the Department of Human Services Federal Funds as designated by the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State to the appropriate State Fund Account those federal funds recovered as reimbursement for indirect costs which are not required to be transferred to the Constitutional and Fiscal Agencies Fund pursuant to Arkansas Code §§19-7-601--19-7-610. The Director of the Department of Human Services shall not transfer State General Revenue appropriation between those Medicaid appropriations authorized for the Department of Human Services.

SECTION 10. CARRY FORWARD. The unexpended balances in appropriations provided for the expenditure of federal funds as provided for in this Act on June 30, 1990 shall be carried forward and made available for expenditures for

the same purpose for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1991.

SECTION 11. DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES. It is hereby found and determined by the Seventy-Seventh General Assembly that regional offices tend to create inefficiency in the operation of the programs and services provided by the Department of Human Services. Therefore, no office of the Department of Human Services shall be called a "Regional Office", nor shall any function of any office, other than the Department of Human Services Central Office, include supervision of any district Department of Human Services Office.

SECTION 12. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS. The Department of Human Services - Economic and Medical Services Division shall file a semi-annual report with the Arkansas Legislative Council concerning performance and progress made in administering the Child Support Enforcement Program approved under Title IV-D of the Social Security Act.

SECTION 13. BIENNIAL GOALS. The Director of the Department of Human Services is hereby directed to adopt the following goals in the Health Delivery and Economic and Medical Programs which he administers for the upcoming biennial period:

1. Develop statewide alternatives to Nursing Home Placement for the financially dependent elderly and disabled citizens of our State;
2. Implement preventive Home Health and Social Maintenance Programs designed to avoid the unnecessary deterioration of the mental and physical health of our State's elderly and disabled citizens which ultimately results in Nursing Home Placement, and;
3. Conduct formal screening of all current nursing home placements in a manner that will assure a systematic means of providing alternatives to Nursing Home Services.

It is further intended that the Arkansas Legislative Council be advised on a quarterly basis as to visible progress in reaching these goals as well as any legislation needed to be considered by the Arkansas General Assembly in this regard.

SECTION 14. Of the state and federal funds appropriated for the Hospital and Medical line item in Section 4 of this Act, a minimum of \$3 million each

year shall be distributed between the Children and Family Services Division and the Mental Health Services Division of the Department of Human Services. These funds shall be allocated based on the prevailing Medicaid state match arrangement for use by these agencies in meeting the needs of the Emotionally Disturbed Youth (EDY) population of this State.

SECTION 15. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized by this Act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the restrictions of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

SECTION 16. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained in this Act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this Act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

SECTION 17. All provisions of this Act of a general and permanent nature are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

SECTION 18. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is hereby found and determined by the Seventy-Seventh General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 1989 is essential to the operation of the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 1989 could work irreparable harm

upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 1989.
