SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE U.S. CONGRESS TO ENACT THE FEDERAL MAIL ORDER  
SALES TAX LEGISLATION AND URGING THE ARKANSAS CONGRESSIONAL  
DELEGATION TO SUPPORT AND PROMOTE THE ENACTMENT OF THAT  
LEGISLATION.

WHEREAS, Arkansas, as well as other states, has difficulty collecting taxes on mail order sales to Arkansas residents by out-of-state mail order companies; and

WHEREAS, as a result, the states are losing a substantial amount of revenues which are desperately needed to provide necessary services to the people; and

WHEREAS, the enactment of the Federal Mail Order Sales Tax Bill would provide much relief to the states,

NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE SEVENTY-SEVENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN:

That the General Assembly hereby urges the U.S. Congress to enact the Federal Mail Order Sales Tax Bill.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the General Assembly hereby urges the Arkansas Congressional Delegation to support and promote enactment of the Federal Mail Order Sales Tax Bill.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that upon adoption of this Resolution, a copy hereof shall be transmitted to the presiding officer of the U. S. Senate and of the U. S. House of Representatives, and to each member of the Arkansas Congressional Delegation.
