SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

RECOGNIZING THE IMPORTANCE OF THE INSURANCE INDUSTRY TO INDIVIDUALS, INDUSTRY AND OTHER BUSINESS, AND TO THE OVERALL STABILITY OF THE ECONOMY OF ARKANSAS AND THE NATION, AND DECLARING WEDNESDAY FEBRUARY 8, 1989, AS INSURANCE INDUSTRY APPRECIATION DAY IN ARKANSAS.

WHEREAS, the insurance industry in Arkansas and the nation and the many individuals involved in the insurance industry, constitute a vital segment of the economy of the state and nation; and

WHEREAS, the concept of insurance, i.e., the pooling of risks and the prepayment of funds to cover losses from various causes, has enabled individuals, industry, business and governments to withstand and survive enormous losses attributable to a multitude of causes including natural disasters; and

WHEREAS, the insurance industry and its services are essential to the continued growth, development and the very survival of business and industry in Arkansas and the nation; and

WHEREAS, it is most appropriate that the Arkansas General Assembly recognize the importance of the industry to the state of Arkansas and her citizens,

NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE SEVENTY-SEVENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:

The General Assembly hereby recognizes the importance of the insurance industry and its services to individuals, industry, business and government in Arkansas and hereby proclaims February 8, 1989 as Insurance Industry Appreciation Day in Arkansas.
