For An Act To Be Entitled

"AN ACT TO CREATE AN ADDITIONAL DEPUTY PROSECUTING ATTORNEY  
FOR MILLER COUNTY, ARKANSAS; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

SECTION 1. In addition to all other deputy prosecuting attorneys provided by law, the Prosecuting Attorney of the Eighth Judicial District of Arkansas shall be entitled to appoint one (1) additional Deputy Prosecuting Attorney for Miller County, Arkansas, which appointment shall be subject to approval by the Judges of the Circuit Court of the Eighth Judicial District of Arkansas.

SECTION 2. The Deputy Prosecuting Attorney appointed pursuant to this act shall be paid a salary of not less than Twenty-five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00), nor more than Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000.00) per annum, from an appropriation to be made by the Quorum Court of Miller County, Arkansas, and paid to said Deputy Prosecuting Attorney in equal monthly installments from the County General Fund of Miller County, Arkansas.

SECTION 3. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

SECTION 4. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are hereby repealed.

SECTION 5. It is hereby found and determined by the General Assembly that there is a great need for the services of an additional deputy prosecuting attorney in Miller County, Arkansas, for the efficient

administration of justice, and this act is necessary to provide the needed manpower for the efficient operation of the Eighth Judicial District's Prosecuting Attorney's office. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this act, being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety, shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval.
