HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE ARKANSAS CONGRESSIONAL DELEGATION TO SUPPORT SUCH CONGRESSIONAL OR ADMINISTRATIVE ACTION AS MAY BE NECESSARY TO AUTHORIZE AND PROMOTE THE USE OF MILITARY PERSONNEL AND EQUIPMENT IN COMBATING ILLEGAL DRUG TRAFFIC.

WHEREAS, one of the most serious problems facing this country today is the illegal drug traffic into and within the country; and

WHEREAS, it is imperative that the United States government use every resource reasonably available to combat the illegal drug problem; and

WHEREAS, the use of military personnel and equipment in the "war on drugs" is not only appropriate, it may be the only means readily available to curtail or stop the flow of illegal drugs into the country,

NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE THIRD EXTRAORDINARY SESSION OF THE SEVENTY-SEVENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:

SECTION 1. The Arkansas General Assembly hereby respectfully urges the members of the Arkansas Congressional Delegation to vigorously support such congressional or administrative action as may be necessary or desirable to authorize and promote the use of military personnel, equipment and supplies to combat the illegal traffic in drugs into and within this country and to otherwise assist in the "war on drugs".

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that upon adoption of this Resolution, the Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives shall transmit a copy hereof to each member of the Arkansas Congressional Delegation.
