HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE JOINT INTERIM COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION TO
ESTABLISH A PROGRAM FOR LEGISLATIVE INTERNS.

WHEREAS, college students in Arkansas have little opportunity to learn about the legislative process in this state; and

WHEREAS, college students studying subjects such as political science, public administration, government or other humanities courses need the opportunity for in-depth study of the legislative process; and

WHEREAS, an ideal way to gain knowledge and experience of the legislative process is by working directly with the members of the General Assembly as legislative interns; and

WHEREAS, a program for legislative interns needs to be developed,

NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE THIRD EXTRAORDINARY SESSION OF THE SEVENTY-SEVENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY, THE SENATE CONCURRING HEREIN:

That the Joint Interim Committee on Education is requested to establish a program for college students studying political science, public administration, government or other related fields of study to serve as legislative interns for the Arkansas General Assembly.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Joint Interim Committee on Education establish all policies, procedures and guidelines necessary for the implementation of this program and propose this program to the 78th General Assembly.
