For An Act To Be Entitled

"AN ACT TO PERMIT DEALERS, RETAILERS, DISTRIBUTORS, AND  
MANUFACTURER REPRESENTATIVES TO MARKET PRODUCTS AND SERVICES  
PRODUCED BY THE ARKANSAS DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTION INDUSTRY  
PROGRAM; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

SECTION 1. The Department of Correction may enter into marketing contracts with dealers, retailers, distributors, and manufacturer representatives thereby permitting them to market and sell all products and services produced by the Arkansas Department of Correction Industry Program in accordance with existing laws and State Purchasing regulations. The Department of Correction Industry Division will be responsible for all billing of purchased products and services to ensure that only customers authorized by law are making said purchases.

SECTION 2. Reimbursement to companies on contract for marketing of said products and services will be based on regulations established by the Board of Correction.

SECTION 3. All provisions of this Act of a general and permanent nature are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

SECTION 4. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are hereby repealed.

SECTION 5. EMERGENCY. It is hereby found and determined by the General Assembly that the Department of Correction is in immediate need of additional

revenues for its Industry Program; this Act will assist the Department in generating additional revenues for their Industry Program; and that this Act should go into effect immediately in order to grant the Department of Correction the necessary authority to generate additional revenues for its Industry Program. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this act being necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval.
