SENATE RESOLUTION

URGING GOVERNOR CLINTON TO VETO ALL BILLS PASSED BY THE THIRD EXTRAORDINARY SESSION OF THE SEVENTY-SEVENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY RELATING TO NEW OR EXPANDED DRUG PROGRAMS OR OTHER PROGRAMS UNLESS MEASURES ARE ENACTED TO RAISE REVENUES TO FUND SUCH NEW OR EXPANDED PROGRAMS.

WHEREAS, legislation to establish new or expanded drug programs and other programs has been enacted by or is currently pending before the Third Extraordinary Session of the Seventy-Seventh General Assembly; and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of the General Assembly that any such new or expanded programs be funded only from revenues generated by legislation enacted by the Third Extraordinary Session; and

WHEREAS, it would be highly detrimental to the public schools, higher education, human services programs, and other existing programs and services to use current revenues to fund new and expanded drug programs and other new or expanded programs,

NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE THIRD EXTRAORDINARY SESSION OF THE SEVENTY-SEVENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

The Senate hereby urges Governor Clinton to veto any and all measures passed by the Third Extraordinary Session of the Seventy-Seventh General Assembly relating to new or expanded programs unless legislation is passed by the Third Extraordinary Session to fund such new or expanded programs.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that upon adoption of this resolution, a copy hereof shall be immediately transmitted to Governor Clinton.
