# A Bill

**HOUSE BILL 1577**

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## 7 **For An Act To Be Entitled**

8 "AN ACT TO SAFEGUARD LIFE, HEALTH AND PROPERTY BY  
9 REQUIRING EARTHQUAKE RESISTANT DESIGN FOR ALL PUBLIC  
10 STRUCTURES TO BE CONSTRUCTED OR REMODELED WITHIN THE  
11 BOUNDARIES OF THIS STATE BEGINNING SEPTEMBER 1, 1991."

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13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

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15 SECTION 1. It is the purpose of this act to protect the public by  
16 requiring that all public structures be designed and constructed to resist  
17 destructive forces when an earthquake occurs in the New Madrid Seismic Zone.

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19 SECTION 2. Definitions. Whenever used in this act, unless a different  
20 meaning clearly appears from the context:

21 (a) "Owner" shall mean any agency of the state, county, city, township,  
22 town, village, or private entity, partnership, business or corporation.

23 (b) "Public Structure" means any building intended, or adaptable, for  
24 public employment, assembly, or any other use if it will be open to the  
25 public. Also included in this definition are certain building types as  
26 defined under the term "Public Works" projects.

27 (c) "Public Works" means works, whether of construction or adaptation,  
28 undertaken and carried out by the national, state, county, school district, or  
29 municipal authorities, and designed to serve some purpose of public necessity,  
30 use, or convenience; such as public buildings, roads, aqueducts, parks, and  
31 all other fixed works constructed for public use. The term relates to the  
32 construction of public improvements and not to their maintenance or operation.

33 (d) "Add to" shall mean adding to existing buildings or structures more  
34 than four thousand (4000) square feet in gross floor area and all areas of  
35 increased building height.

1               (e) "Alter", "retrofit", and "remodel" means any alteration or repair  
2 of a building which when completed will increase the market value of the  
3 building by one hundred percent (100%) or more.

4               (f) "Seal" means the Arkansas seal issued to signify certification of  
5 registration to practice architecture or engineering.

6               (g) "Seismic" means pertaining to an earthquake or earth tremor  
7 (vibrations).

8               (h) "Structural Elements" shall mean all structural load carrying  
9 members of a building or structure required to transmit loads (forces) within  
10 the building or between the building and the ground.

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12               SECTION 3. Seismic Zones Established. Areas within the boundaries of  
13 this State shall be divided into zones of anticipated damage that will occur  
14 in various locations with respect to the New Madrid Seismic Zone.

15               (a) Zone 3. Area of greatest anticipated seismic damage shall include  
16 the following counties: Clay, Greene, Craighead, Mississippi, Poinsett,  
17 Cross, Crittenden, St. Francis, Randolph, Lawrence, Jackson, Woodruff, and  
18 Lee.

19               (b) Zone 2. Area of moderate anticipated seismic damage shall include  
20 the following counties: Sharp, Independence, White, Lonoke, Prairie,  
21 Arkansas, Monroe, Phillips, Fulton, Izard, Stone, and Cleburne.

22               (c) Zone 1. Area of low anticipated seismic damage shall include all  
23 remaining counties within the boundaries of this State.

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25               SECTION 4. Design Requirements. Hereafter, neither the state, any  
26 county, city, township, village or private entity shall construct, add to,  
27 alter, retrofit, or remodel any public structure unless the structural  
28 elements are designed to resist the anticipated forces of the designated  
29 seismic zone in which the structure is located. Design loads and seismic  
30 design requirements shall be, as a minimum, those listed in the chapter of  
31 Minimum Design Loads and Referenced Chapters from the Standard Building Code,  
32 1988 or latest edition with revisions.

33               All construction plans for public buildings and structures shall comply  
34 with Arkansas Code 17-14-101 through 17-14-311. The design of structural  
35 elements of public buildings and structures shall be performed by a  
36 professional engineer registered in the State of Arkansas who is competent in

1 seismic structural design according to current standards of technical  
2 competence. The structural plans of each public building or structure shall  
3 bear the Engineer's Arkansas seal and signature and a statement of reference  
4 to what Seismic Zone the structure is designed to satisfy.

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6 SECTION 5. Exemptions. Certain building types such as single family  
7 residential, duplexes, triplexes, fourplexes, and agricultural structures  
8 shall not be included in the requirements of this act.

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10 SECTION 6. Violations and Penalties. Any owner knowingly constructing  
11 a public building within this State after September 1, 1991, without complying  
12 with the provisions of this act shall be guilty of a Class A misdemeanor and  
13 shall upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of not less than one  
14 thousand dollars (\$1,000). Each day of such unlawful construction practice  
15 shall constitute a distinct and separate offense.

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17 SECTION 7. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature  
18 are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code  
19 Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

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21 SECTION 8. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to  
22 any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect  
23 other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without  
24 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this  
25 act are declared to be severable.

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27 SECTION 9. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are  
28 hereby repealed.
