HOUSE BILL

For An Act To Be Entitled

8 "AN ACT TO PROHIBIT ENTERING ANOTHER'S LAND OUTSIDE AN
9 INCORPORATED AREA FOR CERTAIN RECREATIONAL PURPOSES
10 WITHOUT WRITTEN PERMISSION; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES."

12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

14 SECTION 1. Except for those persons identified in Section 2 of this
15 Act, no person shall without written permission enter upon another person's
16 property located outside the boundaries of any city or town while in
17 possession of a deadly weapon or fishing equipment; nor shall any such person
18 without written permission operate a motor vehicle upon another person's
19 property located outside the boundaries of any city or town.

21 SECTION 2. The provisions of this Act shall not apply to guests,
22 invitees, public land, privately-owned land open to the public, nor to people
23 required to enter upon the premise of another for business reasons or for
24 health and safety reasons.

26 SECTION 3. Violations of this Act shall constitute a class B
27 misdemeanor.

29 SECTION 4. This Act repeals all posting laws of this State to the
30 extent they apply to property located outside the boundaries of any city or
31 town.

33 SECTION 5. All provisions of this Act of a general and permanent nature
34 are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code
35 Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

SECTION 6. If any provision of this Act or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the Act which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this Act are declared to be severable.

SECTION 7. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are hereby repealed.
