HOUSE BILL

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7 **For An Act To Be Entitled**

8 "AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE CREATION OF AN ADDITIONAL
9 MUNICIPAL JUDGESHIP IN THE CITY OF HOT SPRINGS; TO SET THE
10 SALARIES OF THE JUDGES AND CLERKS FOR THE HOT SPRINGS
11 MUNICIPAL COURTS; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES."

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13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

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15 SECTION 1. (a) The quorum court of Garland County and the Board of
16 Directors of the city of Hot Springs are hereby authorized by ordinances of
17 the two bodies to create an additional municipal court judgeship for the Hot
18 Springs Municipal Court. If such additional judgeship is created, the current
19 municipal judge shall preside over the First Division of the Hot Springs
20 Municipal Court and the person selected to the new judgeship shall preside
21 over the Second Division of the Hot Springs Municipal Court.

22 If an additional judgeship is created as authorized herein, the person
23 to fill such position shall be elected at the next General Election after such
24 authorization for a term of four (4) years, and all successors shall be
25 elected for terms of four (4) years.

26 (b) Each Hot Springs Municipal Court judge shall receive an annual
27 salary of not less than forty thousand dollars (\$40,000) nor more than fifty-
28 nine thousand dollars (\$59,000) and each Hot Springs Municipal Court clerk
29 shall receive an annual salary of not less than twenty-two thousand dollars
30 (\$22,000) nor more than twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000). The salaries
31 shall be determined by the governing body of the city of Hot Springs and the
32 quorum court of Garland County.

33 (c) The salaries of the municipal judges and the municipal court clerks
34 and any special judges authorized by this subdivision and the operating
35 expenses of the Hot Springs Municipal Courts shall be paid fifty percent (50%)

1 by the city of Hot Springs and fifty percent (50%) by Garland County. The
2 municipal judges shall be of good moral character, residents of the county and
3 the state, and shall possess the qualifications required by law for circuit
4 and chancery judges. In the event a municipal judge is ill, absent, or
5 temporarily disqualified, that municipal judge shall designate a member of the
6 bar regularly practicing in the court to serve in his place during the
7 illness, absence, or disqualification of the municipal judge, and he shall
8 have all the powers and authority of the municipal judge.

9 (d) Upon the vacancy in the office of municipal judge caused by death
10 or otherwise, the governing body of the city shall appoint a person possessing
11 the qualifications required for municipal judge, who shall serve until the
12 next general election, at which election a municipal judge shall be elected in
13 the manner provided by law for the election of the municipal judge to fill the
14 unexpired term of the municipal judge so vacating the office.

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16 SECTION 2. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature
17 are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code
18 Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

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20 SECTION 3. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to
21 any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect
22 other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without
23 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this
24 act are declared to be severable.

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26 SECTION 4. (a) Arkansas Code 16-17-108(bb) is hereby repealed.

27 (b) All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are hereby
28 repealed.

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
