For An Act To Be Entitled

8 "TO PROVIDE FOR THE REDISTRICTING OF THE CONGRESSIONAL

9 DISTRICTS OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS; AND FOR OTHER

10 PURPOSES."

12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

13

14 SECTION 1. The State of Arkansas is hereby divided into four (4)

15 Congressional Districts, provided that the members of the House of

16 Representatives of the United States Congress presently serving from each of

17 the existing Congressional Districts of this State shall continue to serve

18 until the expiration of their current terms, and successor Congressmen shall

19 be elected from the Congressional Districts as established in this Act. It is

20 the intention of this Act to provide for Congressional Districts of

21 substantially equal population in order to comply with the Equal Protection

22 Clause of the 14th Amendment to the Constitution of the United States.

24 SECTION 2. The First Congressional District shall be composed of:

25 Fulton County, Izard County, Sharp County, Stone County, Cleburne County,

26 Independence County, Randolph County, Clay County, Lawrence County, Greene

27 County, Jackson County, Craighead County, Poinsett County, Mississippi County,

28 Prairie County, Woodruff County, Cross County, St. Francis County, Crittenden

29 County, Monroe County, Lee County, Arkansas County, Phillips County, Van Buren

30 County, and all of Lonoke County except that portion of York Township located

31 west of State Highway 89 to First Street, North on First Street to Olive

32 Street, West on Olive Street to Third Street, North on Third Street to Locust

1 *Street, West on Locust Street to Fourth Street, North on Fourth Street to*
2 *Mockingbird Lane, North on Mockingbird Lane to Hudson Branch Creek, West on*
3 *Hudson Branch Creek to U.S. Highway 67, North on U.S. Highway 67 to Four Mile*
4 *Creek. The qualified electors residing within the First Congressional*
5 *District shall elect one (1) member of the House of Representatives of the*
6 *United States.*

8 SECTION 3. The Second Congressional District shall be composed of:
9 Perry County, Yell County, Conway County, Pulaski County, Faulkner County,
10 White County, that part of Lonoke County which is not included in the First
11 Congressional District, that part of Saline County which is not included in
12 the Fourth Congressional District and the area of Pope County starting at the
13 Conway-Pope County line south of Gum Log Creek to State Highway 105, North to
14 State Highway 326, West on State Highway 326 to Gravel Hill Road, North on
15 Gravel Hill Road to Morgan Road, West on Morgan Road to State Highway 7, South
16 on State Highway 7 to Bakers Creek Road, South on Bakers Creek Road to Shiloh
17 Road, East on Shiloh Road to State Highway 326, South on State Highway 326 to
18 Interstate 40, East on Interstate 40 to State Highway 331, South on State
19 Highway 331 to U.S. Highway 64, East on U.S. Highway 64 to Tyler Road, South
20 on Tyler Road to State Highway 331, West on State Highway 331 to Mt. Zion
21 Road, South on Mt. Zion Road to State Highway 247, East on State Highway 247
22 to Tanyard Branch, South by Tanyard Branch to the Arkansas River. The
23 qualified electors residing with the Second Congressional District shall elect
24 one (1) member of the House of Representatives of the United States.

26 SECTION 4. The Third Congressional District shall be composed of:
27 Baxter County, Marion County, Boone County, Carroll County, Benton County,
28 Washington County, Madison County, Newton County, Searcy County, Pope County,
29 Johnson County, Franklin County, Crawford County, Sebastian County, Logan
30 County, Scott County, Polk County, that part of Pope County not included in
31 the Second Congressional District and the portion of Montgomery County which
32 lies south of U.S. Highway 270 beginning at the Scott-Montgomery County line
33 and continuing on U.S. Highway 270 to the Ouachita River and north of the
34 Ouachita River. The qualified electors residing within the Third
35 Congressional District shall elect one (1) member of the House of
36 Representatives of the United States.

SECTION 5. The Fourth Congressional District shall be composed of:

Grant County, Howard County, Sevier County, Jefferson County, Hot Spring County, Garland County, Pike County, Clark County, Dallas County, Cleveland County, Lincoln County, Hempstead County, Nevada County, Ouachita County, Calhoun County, Bradley County, Drew County, Desha County, Chicot County, Ashley County, Union County, Columbia County, Lafayette County, Miller County, Little River County, that part of Montgomery County not included in the Third Congressional District, and the portion of Saline County inclusive of the Grant-Saline County line North on Holly Creek Road to Holly Creek, West on Holly Creek to State Highway 291, West on State Highway 291 to the Missouri-Pacific Railroad tracks, North on the Missouri-Pacific Railroad tracks to Vulcan Road, West on Vulcan Road to State Highway 229, North on State Highway 229 to U.S. Highway 67, North on U.S. Highway 67 to River Road, West on River Road to Interstate 30, South on Interstate 30 to the Saline-Hot Spring County line. The qualified electors residing within the Fourth Congressional District shall elect one (1) member of the House of Representatives of the United States.

SECTION 6. All provisions of this Act of a general and permanent nature are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

SECTION 7. If any provision of this Act or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the Act which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this Act are declared to be severable.

SECTION 8. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are hereby repealed.
