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HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

8 THE ARKANSAS GENERAL ASSEMBLY AND THE STATE OF ARKANSAS
9 IN THEIR POLICIES WILL SUPPORT THE MONTREAL PROTOCOL ON
10 SUBSTANCES THAT DEPLETE THE OZONE LAYER AND THE 1990
11 CLEAN AIR ACT AS A PRACTICAL EFFICIENT WAY OF REDUCING
12 CFC's AND PROTECTING OUR ENVIRONMENT.

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14 WHEREAS, worldwide emissions of certain substances can significantly
15 deplete the ozone layer in a manner that is likely to result in adverse
16 effects on human health and the environment, and

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18 WHEREAS, fully halogenated CFC's and halons threaten the stratospheric
19 ozone, and

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21 WHEREAS, the Montreal Protocol has been ratified by more than 60 nations
22 representing greater than 90% of world use of CFC's and halons, and

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24 WHEREAS, the Montreal Protocol calls for a phase out of CFC's in
25 developed countries by the year 2000, and

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27 WHEREAS, the United States has ratified the Montreal Protocol and passed
28 the 1990 Clean Air Act, and

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30 WHEREAS, the 1990 Clean Air Act will further regulate CFC's and halons
31 and require EPA to implement a more stringent phase out schedule for CFC's,
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34 WHEREAS, CFC's are widely used and currently essential in some products,
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2 WHEREAS, the industry is working on alternatives to CFC's, and

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4 WHEREAS, premature substitution could result in the use of unsafe or
5 environmentally harmful substitutes, and

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7 WHEREAS, accelerating the elimination of CFC's without providing
8 commercially viable substitutes could cause unnecessary economic disruption
9 including business failures and job loss, and

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11 WHEREAS, in many cases, substitutes will require redesigning processes
12 and equipment, and

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14 WHEREAS, protection of stratospheric ozone is a global concern which
15 requires international cooperation, and

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17 WHEREAS, Arkansas supports the current efforts to phase out CFC's and
18 substitute viable safe alternatives.

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20 NOW THEREFORE,

21 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE SEVENTY-EIGHTH GENERAL
22 ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:

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24 That the Arkansas General Assembly and the State of Arkansas in their policies
25 will support the Montreal Protocol and the 1990 Clean Air Act as a practical
26 efficient method of reducing CFC's and protecting our environment.

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
