## **HOUSE RESOLUTION**

8 COMMEMORATION OF THE BICENTENNIAL OF THE BILL OF RIGHTS

10 WHEREAS, 1991 is the Bicentennial of the ratification of the Bill of  
11 Rights to the United States Constitution; and

13            WHEREAS, the tremendous changes which have taken place around the globe  
14 in recent years have stirred the hearts and souls of men and women everywhere  
15 yearning for freedom; and

17 WHEREAS, the world looks to us in America to light the torch of liberty  
18 and to lead by example in the path of true representative democracy; and

20 WHEREAS, people in so many countries have recently thrown off the yoke  
21 of tyranny and dictatorship and are now seeking to understand how government  
22 of, by, and for the people can indeed ensure the inalienable rights of life,  
23 liberty, and the pursuit of happiness; and

25 WHEREAS, we stand eternally grateful to our forefathers who fought and  
26 died that we might have these rights; that it is therefore fitting that we  
27 should regularly pause and ponder these rights and, to the extent that we are  
28 able, strive to fulfill the duties that accompany them; and

30 WHEREAS, we recognize that because of these first ten (10) Amendments to  
31 the United States Constitution, the rights of individuals, however unpopular  
32 or in the minority, are and have been protected these two hundred (200) years;

35 WHEREAS, the Founders of this great nation laid down for all time in the

1 Declaration of Independence that "all men are created equal, and endowed by  
2 their Creator with certain inalienable rights" we know that the principles  
3 outlined in the Bill of Rights do not pertain only to Americans, but should be  
4 rights inherent to all mankind;

7 NOW THEREFORE,

8 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE SEVENTY-EIGHTH GENERAL

9 ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

11         Do hereby proclaim 1991 to be the Bill of Rights Bicentennial in the  
12 State of Arkansas and ask all citizens to join in commemoration of the Bill of  
13 Rights, and that the Superintendent of Public Instruction shall direct all  
14 school principals to devote at least one hour to the rededication and  
15 reinforcement of the principles embodied in the Bill of Rights in all public  
16 schools in the State of Arkansas during the month of November, 1991, which  
17 shall be declared Bill of Rights Month in celebration of this Bicentennial.
