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## **HOUSE RESOLUTION**

8 REQUESTING THE FORMATION OF A "ONE-STOP GOVERNMENT" TASK  
9 FORCE TO STUDY THE FEASIBILITY OF UTILIZING COMPUTER  
10 TECHNOLOGY TO INCREASE EFFICIENCY IN CITIZEN CONTACTS WITH  
11 VARIOUS GOVERNMENT AGENCIES.

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14 WHEREAS, through the years state and local governments have imposed upon  
15 its citizens burdensome requirements while paying taxes, registering a motor  
16 vehicle and registering to vote; and

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18 WHEREAS, the advent of computer technology offers an opportunity for a  
19 comprehensive streamlining of several of these requirements to provide "one-  
20 stop government" where a citizen could perform several governmental tasks at  
21 the same time and reduce the amount of documentation necessary to comply with  
22 government requirements; and

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24 WHEREAS, a comprehensive study to streamline the various citizen  
25 contacts with government agencies during procedures for driver's license  
26 renewal, motor vehicle registration, property assessment, payment of taxes,  
27 verification of insurance coverage, voter registration, and other governmental  
28 contacts as found by the task force would assist the General Assembly in  
29 preparing legislative proposals for the Seventy-Ninth Session of the General  
30 Assembly; and

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32 WHEREAS, a task force comprised of at least three (3) members of the  
33 House of Representatives, one (1) of which shall be named chairman of the task  
34 force, and representatives from the Department of Finance and Administration,  
35 Department of Computer Services and Insurance Department, a county tax

1 assessor, a county clerk, specialists from the private sector in computer  
2 technology, a representative of the insurance industry, a member of the League  
3 of Women Voters, and such other persons as necessary to conduct the study and  
4 who demonstrate a willingness to devote the necessary time to participate in  
5 the task force efforts should be appointed by the Speaker of the House of  
6 Representatives to assist the General Assembly during the interim to study the  
7 feasibility of development of a comprehensive, efficient one-stop government  
8 network system;

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11 NOW THEREFORE,

12 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE SEVENTY-EIGHTH GENERAL  
13 ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

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15 THAT the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint as soon  
16 as possible following adjournment to the Seventy-Eighth Session of the  
17 Arkansas General Assembly a Task Force for One-Stop Government comprised of  
18 those persons noted above to conduct a comprehensive study of the feasibility  
19 of utilizing advanced computer technology to provide "one-stop government" to  
20 the citizens of this state.

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22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the Task Force shall meet at such times as  
23 called by the chairman and shall present a report of their findings and  
24 recommendations, along with any legislative proposals to the Speaker of the  
25 House of Representatives before December 15, 1992.
