8 "AN ACT TO AMEND TITLE 24, CHAPTER 11, SUBCHAPTER 8 OF THE  
9 ARKANSAS CODE OF 1987 TO PROVIDE FOR PROPORTIONATE  
10 REPRESENTATION BETWEEN ACTIVE AND RETIRED MEMBERS TO SERVE  
11 ON LOCAL FIREMEN'S PENSION AND RELIEF FUNDS; AND FOR OTHER  
12 PURPOSES."

14 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

16 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code §24-11-801 is hereby amended to read as  
17 follows:

18 "24-11-801. Board of trustees - Members.

19 (a) *The Board of Trustees of every Firemen's Pension and Relief Fund*  
20 *established in a city, incorporated town or duly qualified fire protection*  
21 *district pursuant to the provisions of this subchapter shall be composed of*  
22 *the following:*

23 (1) *The chief executive, who shall serve as chairman of the*  
24 *board;*

25 (2) *The city or district clerk or recorder, who shall serve as*  
26 *secretary of the board;*

27 (3) *The fire chief, or, if the fire chief is not a member of the*  
28 *fund, the highest ranking member of the fire department who is a member and*  
29 *who is willing to serve; and*

30 (4) *Four (4) active or retired members of the pension fund.*

31 (b) The board thus created shall provide for the disbursement of the  
32 firemen's relief and pension fund and shall designate its beneficiaries as  
33 directed in this act.

34 (c) The fire department shall elect the active member or members by  
35 secret written ballot in May of each year, with the member or members to be

1 chosen in alternating years.

2           (d) The retired members shall elect the retired member or members by  
3 secret written ballot in May of each year, with the member or members to be  
4 chosen in alternating years by a method to be determined by the board.

5           (e) All member trustees shall serve two (2) year terms.

6           (f) The number of active members or retired members to serve on the  
7 board shall be determined by the proportionate number of active members to  
8 retired members:

9               (1) When the number of active members equals seventy-five percent  
10 (75%) of the total of retired members and active members, the board shall be  
11 comprised of three (3) active members and one (1) retired member.

12               (2) When the number of active members equals fifty percent (50%)  
13 of the total of retired members and active members, the board shall be  
14 comprised of two (2) active members and two (2) retired members.

15               (3) When the number of retired members equals seventy-five  
16 percent (75%) of the total of retired members and active members, the board  
17 shall be comprised of one (1) active member and three (3) retired members.

18               (4) However, when no retitant is available to serve on the board,  
19 all four (4) employee positions shall be held by active members of the pension  
20 fund and shall all be elected for two (2) year terms as provided in subsection  
21 (e) of this section. However, when no active member is available to serve on  
22 the board, all four (4) positions shall be held by retired members of the  
23 pension fund and shall all be elected for two (2) year terms as provided in  
24 subsection (c) of this section.

25           (g) The board shall have the power to make all rules and regulations  
26 needful for its guidance to implement the provisions regarding board  
27 composition.

28           (h) The chief executive in the cities, incorporated towns, or fire  
29 protection districts shall be the chairman; the city or town clerk or recorder  
30 or clerk of the fire protection district shall be ex officio secretary; and  
31 the city, town, or fire protection district treasurer shall be ex officio  
32 treasurer of the board of trustees during his respective term of office as the  
33 official of the city, incorporated town, or fire protection district.

34           (i) The secretary and treasurer of each board of trustees shall report  
35 annually, at the same time annual reports are required as clerk, recorder, or

1 treasurer, the precise status of the firemen's relief and pension fund,  
2 showing all receipts and disbursements on account with a full and complete  
3 list of all beneficiaries of the fund and the amount paid each beneficiary."

5 SECTION 2. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature  
6 are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code  
7 Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

8

9 SECTION 3. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to  
10 any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect  
11 other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without  
12 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this  
13 act are declared to be severable.

14

15 SECTION 4. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are  
16 hereby repealed.
