SENATE BILL 236

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7 **For An Act To Be Entitled**

8 "AN ACT TO AMEND ARKANSAS CODE ANN. TITLE 6, CHAPTER 42,
9 TO ADD A NEW SUBCHAPTER 2, TO ESTABLISH THE ARKANSAS
10 SCHOOL FOR MATHEMATICS AND SCIENCE; AND FOR OTHER
11 PURPOSES."

13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

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15 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated is hereby amended to add the
16 following:

17 "6-42-201 (a). There is hereby established the Arkansas School for
18 Mathematics and Sciences (hereinafter 'School') which shall be a residential
19 school for eleventh and twelfth grade students. The purpose of the School
20 shall be to educate the gifted and talented math and science students of the
21 state and to develop curriculum and materials to improve instruction in
22 mathematics and science for all students in the State. The School's
23 curriculum, faculty, and admissions policy shall reflect such purposes. While
24 the emphasis of the School shall be dedicated to the academic teaching of
25 mathematics and sciences, some emphasis may be placed on the arts and
26 humanities as deemed appropriate by the *State Department of Education*
27 (hereinafter 'Department').

28 (b) The School shall be located on the campus of an Arkansas
29 institution of higher education or at such other appropriate facility which
30 can provide the classrooms, laboratories, library facilities, dormitories, and
31 other services necessary for the proper operation and support of the School.
32 The School shall be funded by monies appropriated by the General Assembly for
33 the operation of the School and by such grants, contributions, or donations
34 which may be received by the *Department* for the support of the School.
35 Students selected to attend the School shall not be required to pay tuition,

1 fees, or room and board.

2 6-42-202 (a). *The School shall be governed by the Department with the*
3 *advice and counsel of a nine-member advisory Board of Directors. The Director*
4 *of the General Education Division of the Department of Education, the Director*
5 *of the Department of Higher Education, and the President of the Arkansas*
6 *Science and Technology Authority shall serve on the Advisory Board. The*
7 *remaining six members shall be appointed by the Governor. Two of the initial*
8 *appointees shall be appointed for a term of one year; two for a term of two*
9 *years; and two for a term of three years. Subsequent appointments to the*
10 *Board shall be for three year terms. No appointee to the Board shall serve*
11 *more than nine years. The Board shall annually elect a Chairman and such*
12 *other officers as the Board shall determine appropriate.*

13 (b) *By March 1, 1991, the Department shall develop a plan for*
14 *structure, operation and funding of the School which shall include equitable*
15 *procedures for student recruitment. The Department shall then publish a*
16 *request for proposals to solicit proposals from institutions of higher*
17 *education or other appropriate organizations or agencies for hosting the*
18 *School. By July 1, 1992, the Department shall select a location for the*
19 *School to begin operation for the 1992-93 School year. If the Department*
20 *determines that the School can be more effectively and efficiently operated by*
21 *a longer planning and development phase, the Department may delay the initial*
22 *term of the School until the 1993-94 School year.*

23 (c) *The Department shall prepare the biennial budget request for the*
24 *School's operation which shall be submitted to the State Board of Education*
25 *for inclusion in the biennial budget request of the Department of Education*
26 *for funding programs from the Public School Fund.*

27 6-42-203(a). *The Director of the Department of Education shall employ*
28 *an administrator for the School who shall serve at the pleasure of the*
29 *Director of the Department of Education. The Administrator shall be the chief*
30 *administrative officer of the School and shall administer the School in*
31 *accordance with the policies established by the Department.*

32 (b) *The Administrator and other personnel employed for the operation of*
33 *the School shall be employees of the State of Arkansas. Faculty members and*
34 *other personnel required for operation of the School shall be recommended for*
35 *employment by the Administrator and shall be employed by annual contract by*

1 the *Department*. Teachers and administrators so employed shall be eligible for
2 membership in the Arkansas Teacher Retirement System and earn credited service
3 for such employment. Non-educational personnel employed by the *Department*
4 shall be eligible for membership in the Public Employees Retirement System and
5 earn credited service for such employment.

6 (c) There is hereby established and authorized for the Arkansas School
7 for Mathematics and Sciences the following maximum number of employees and the
8 maximum salaries for such employees.

19 A teacher employed by an Arkansas public school immediately prior to
20 employment by the Arkansas Math and Science High School whose teaching salary
21 from such district was in excess of the maximum salary authorized by this
22 section may be paid a maximum amount not to exceed his or her previous salary
23 from such public school district.

24 6-42-204 (a). The State Department of Education, the Department of
25 Higher Education, and the Arkansas Science and Technology Authority shall
26 provide technical assistance to the staff of the School. The *Department* shall
27 also be authorized to contract with other agencies and/or private research
28 centers as it may deem necessary in carrying out its responsibilities for the
29 operation of the School.

30 (b) The *Department* is authorized and empowered to receive
31 contributions, donations, gifts, bequeaths of money, other forms of financial
32 assistance and/or property, equipment, materials, or personnel from persons,
33 foundations, trust funds, corporations, organizations and other sources,
34 private or public, to be expended and utilized for the operation of the
35 School.

1 6-42-205. The Department shall supervise the Arkansas School for
2 Mathematics and Sciences and is hereby authorized and empowered to promulgate
3 rules and regulations that may be necessary to carry out the provisions of
4 this subchapter."

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6 SECTION 2. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature
7 are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code
8 Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

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10 SECTION 3. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to
11 any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect
12 other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without
13 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this
14 act are declared to be severable.

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16 SECTION 4. All laws or parts of laws in conflict with this act are
17 hereby repealed.

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19 SECTION 5. EMERGENCY. It is hereby found and determined by the General
20 Assembly that there is an urgent need for the establishment of a residential
21 school the purpose of which is to educate gifted and talented math and science
22 students of this State; to establish a unique institution to develop
23 curriculum and materials to improve mathematics and science instruction for
24 all students in this State; for the appointment of a Board to advise with the
25 Department in the development of plans for such School's structure, operation
26 and funding so that the School may begin operation in the 1992-93 school year;
27 and that this Act is designed to correct this situation and should be given
28 effect immediately for this purpose. Therefore, an emergency is hereby
29 declared to exist and this Act being immediately necessary for the
30 preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in full force and
31 effect from and after its passage and approval.
