7 **For An Act To Be Entitled**

8 *"AN ACT TO ALLOW POLICE PENSION FUNDS IN CERTAIN FIRST
9 CLASS CITIES TO AWARD PARTIAL DISABILITY PENSIONS TO
10 ELIGIBLE MEMBERS; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES."*

12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

14 SECTION 1. (a) (1) *If any member of the police department of a first
15 class city with a population in excess of 170,000 persons as determined by the
16 1990 population totals as published by the Bureau of the Census, Department of
17 Commerce, United States of America, shall become physically or mentally
18 permanently disabled and this fact is certified to by the physician on the
19 board of trustees, he shall be entitled to retire and receive a pension as
20 provided herein. The physician's certification shall state whether the
21 disability is total or partial. In the event such disability is partial the
22 physician shall state the extent of such partial disability, apportioned to
23 the body as a whole, in percentage terms. The board may first require that a
24 second evaluation be performed by another physician to be named by the
25 trustees. No member shall be retired for disability for natural causes unless
26 he has served at least five (5) years.*

27 (A) If the disability injury or disease occurred while not
28 actually performing work in gainful employment for the police department, and
29 the physician member of the board certifies that such disability is total, the
30 monthly benefit shall be equal to the benefit paid to normal service
31 retirants. If the physician member of the board certifies that such
32 disability is partial, the monthly benefits shall be equal to the benefit paid
33 to normal service retirants multiplied by the percentage the member is
34 disabled, as certified by the physician member of the board.

35 (B) If, however, a police officer if injured in the line of

1 duty, and the physician member of the board certifies that such disability is
2 total, the monthly disability benefit shall either be equal to sixty-five
3 percent (65%) of the salary attached to the rank held by the member in the
4 police department or shall be equal to the benefit paid to normal service
5 retirants, whichever is greater. If the physician member certifies that such
6 disability is partial, the monthly benefit shall be equal to sixty-five
7 percent (65%) of the salary attached to the rank held by the member in the
8 police department or shall be equal to the benefit paid to normal service
9 retirants, whichever is greater, multiplied by the percentage the member is
10 disabled, as certified by the physician member of the board.

11 (i) For purposes of this section, injured in the
12 line of duty means a disabling injury or disease which occurs while
13 conducting official police department operations or while in training to
14 become a policeman.

22 SECTION 2. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature
23 are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code
24 Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code

25
26 SECTION 3. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to
27 any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect
28 other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without
29 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this
30 act are declared to be severable

31
32 SECTION 4. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are
33 repealed.
