# A Bill

**SENATE BILL 419**

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## 7 **For An Act To Be Entitled**

8 "AN ACT TO CREATE AND ESTABLISH A CRIMINAL JUSTICE SYSTEM  
9 CONSORTIUM; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES."

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11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

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13 SECTION 1. The title of this act shall be the Arkansas Criminal Justice  
14 System Consortium Act of 1991.

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16 SECTION 2. (a) There is hereby created and established a Criminal  
17 Justice System Consortium to implement a statewide program to insure  
18 educational benefits to convicted low risk offenders in order to facilitate  
19 those persons obtaining employment and becoming productive citizens; The  
20 Consortium will be based upon The Sentence to Education Project which operated  
21 as a pilot in Jefferson County, Arkansas during 1989-90.

22 (b) *The Consortium shall serve in an advisory capacity to the Director  
23 of the Arkansas Adult Probation Commission and shall consist of twelve (12)  
24 persons as follows:*

25 (1) One (1) member of the general public appointed by the  
26 Governor;

27 (2) One (1) member of the Arkansas Senate to be appointed by the  
28 President Pro Tempore of the Senate;

29 (3) One (1) member of the Arkansas House of Representatives to be  
30 appointed by the Speaker of the House;

31 (4) One (1) representative of the Arkansas Adult Probation  
32 Commission or his appointed representative;

33 (5) One (1) representative from the Board of the Arkansas  
34 Department of Correction or his appointed representative;

35 (6) One (1) representative from the Arkansas Juvenile Court

1 system to be appointed by the Governor;

2                   (7) One (1) representative from the Arkansas Municipal Court  
3 System to be appointed by the Governor;

4                   (8) The Chairman of the Board of Pardons and Paroles or his  
5 appointed representative;

6                   (9) The Director of the Division of Vocational and Technical  
7 Education or his appointed representative;

8                   (10) One (1) representative from a private Industry Council  
9 established under the Job Training Partnership Act to be appointed by the  
10 Governor;

11                  (11) The Superintendent of the Adult Education-Sponsoring School  
12 District or his appointed representative;

13                  (12) The Director of Arkansas Literacy Inc. or his appointed  
14 representative.

15                  (c) The members of the Board shall serve at the will of the person or  
16 organization appointing them, but shall cease to serve if at any time they do  
17 not properly represent the group, organization or agency they were chosen  
18 from.

19                  (d) The Consortium shall elect from its own number a chairman and such  
20 other officers as may be necessary to carry on its business.

21                  (e) The members of the Consortium shall serve without compensation, but  
22 shall be reimbursed for their actual expenses attending meetings of the  
23 Consortium and performing official duties.

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25                  SECTION 3. (a) The responsibilities of the Criminal Justice System  
26 Consortium shall include advisory assistance to the Director of the Arkansas  
27 Adult Probation Commission in setting goals, planning, policy development,  
28 monitoring policy decisions to ensure the achievement of goals and objectives,  
29 and evaluation.

30                  (b) The Director of the Arkansas Adult Probation Commission shall  
31 hire a State Project Coordinator. The State Project Coordinator shall be  
32 responsible for hiring an Assistant State Project Coordinator/Lead Project  
33 Counselor, four (4) Project Counselors, a Bookkeeper/Office Manager, and a  
34 Secretary/Receptionist.

35                  (c) The Consortium shall form a linkage and support  
36 collaborations with other community organizations, both public and private,

1 and shall interpret the project to the community. The Arkansas Adult  
2 Probation Commission will serve as an applicant agent for federal, state and  
3 private funds essential to facilitate the project, will adopt and monitor the  
4 program budget, and keep itself informed of project operations and protect the  
5 assets of the Consortium.

6 (d) For the purpose of implementing the project statewide, the  
7 state will be divided into four (4) regions.

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9 SECTION 4. (a) The Adult Education Centers will provide facilities for  
10 staff persons as in-kind contributions to the project.

11 (b) Adult Education Centers participating in special programs  
12 will be assisted in making application by the State Project Coordinator. The  
13 Centers will be responsible for the administration of the program consistent  
14 with the grant agreement approved by the Consortium.

15 (c) The Adult Education Centers shall provide instruction for  
16 probationers and parolees.

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18 SECTION 5. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature  
19 are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code  
20 Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

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22 SECTION 6. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to  
23 any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect  
24 other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without  
25 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this  
26 act are declared to be severable.

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28 SECTION 7. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are  
29 hereby repealed.
