## **SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION**

7 TO RESCIND THE PREVIOUS APPLICATION BY THE GENERAL  
8 ASSEMBLY TO THE CONGRESS OF THE UNITED STATES THAT IT CALL  
9 A CONSTITUTIONAL CONVENTION TO PROPOSE AN AMENDMENT TO THE  
10 CONSTITUTION TO BALANCE THE PUBLIC DEBT.

12 WHEREAS, under Article V of the Constitution of the United States,  
13 amendments to the Federal Constitution may be proposed by the Congress  
14 whenever two-thirds of both Houses deem it necessary, or on the application of  
15 the Legislatures of two-thirds of the several states, the Congress shall call  
16 a Constitutional Convention for the purpose of proposing amendments; and

17 WHEREAS, by House Joint Resolution 1, adopted by the House of  
18 Representatives on January 9, 1979, and adopted by the Senate on January 17,  
19 1979 and again on January 22, 1979 after the previous vote was expunged, the  
20 General Assembly of the State of Arkansas requested the Congress of the United  
21 States to prepare and submit to the several states an amendment to the  
22 Constitution of the United States requiring, in the absence of a national  
23 emergency, that the total of all federal appropriations made by Congress for  
24 any fiscal year may not exceed the total of all estimated federal revenues for  
25 that fiscal year, or alternatively, the General Assembly made application and  
26 requested the Congress of the United States to call a Constitutional  
27 Convention for the purpose of proposing such an amendment to the federal  
28 Constitution; and

29 WHEREAS, many legal experts believe that a convention, notwithstanding  
30 whatever limitation might be placed upon it by the call of said convention,  
31 would have within the scope of its authority the complete redrafting of the  
32 Constitution of the United States of America, thereby creating a great danger  
33 to the well-established rights of our people and to the constitutional  
34 principles under which we are presently governed; and

1        WHEREAS, the Constitution of the United States of America has been  
2 extensively interpreted and has proven to be a basically sound document which  
3 protects the freedom of all Americans; and

4        WHEREAS, there is no need for a new constitution, the adoption of which  
5 would create legal chaos in America and only begin the process of another two  
6 centuries of litigation over its interpretation by the courts; and

7        WHEREAS, such changes as may be needed in the present Constitution of  
8 the United States may be proposed and enacted by the well-established methods  
9 of amendment contained therein.

11 NOW THEREFORE,

12 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE SEVENTY-EIGHTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE  
13 STATE OF ARKANSAS, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN:

15        THAT the General Assembly does hereby rescind its application to the  
16 Congress of the United States made by the General Assembly in 1979 by House  
17 Joint Resolution 1 pursuant to Article V of the Constitution of the United  
18 States of American for the calling of a constitutional convention for any  
19 purpose, limited or general.

20        BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution be sent to the  
21 members of the Congress from Arkansas, the Clerk of the United States House of  
22 Representatives, Washington, D.C., and the Secretary of the United States  
23 Senate, Washington, D.C., with the request that this action by the General  
24 Assembly of the State of Arkansas be promptly published in the Congressional  
25 Record.
