For An Act To Be Entitled

9 "AN ACT TO AMEND ARKANSAS CODE 6-67-101 AND TO REPEAL
10 ARKANSAS CODE 6-67-110 PERTAINING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF
11 CENTRAL ARKANSAS."

13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

15 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code 6-67-101 is hereby amended to read as follows:

17 "6-67-101. Establishment and Purpose. For the purposes of providing
18 educational opportunities at the university level on a statewide basis and
19 more adequately fulfilling its changing role as a multi-purpose, comprehensive
20 institution of higher learning, there is established and maintained an
21 institution to be known as the 'University of Central Arkansas'. "

23 SECTION 2. Arkansas Code Section 6-67-110 is hereby repealed.

25 SECTION 3. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature
26 are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code
27 Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

29 SECTION 4. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to
30 any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect
31 other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without
32 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this
33 act are declared to be severable.

34

35 SECTION 5. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are

1 hereby repealed.

2

3 SECTION 6. It is hereby found and determined by the General Assembly
4 that some of the language in the law establishing the University of Central
5 Arkansas is obsolete and should be eliminated as soon as possible. Since this
6 act will eliminate the obsolete language, an emergency is hereby declared to
7 exist and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the
8 public peace, health and safety shall be in full force and effect from and
9 after its passage and approval.
