**HOUSE BILL 1042**

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## 7 **For An Act To Be Entitled**

8 "AN ACT TO INCREASE THE RACIAL AND ETHNIC SENSITIVITY OF  
9 TEACHERS AND ADMINISTRATORS IN ARKANSAS SCHOOLS BY  
10 REQUIRING THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION TO DEVELOP AND  
11 IMPLEMENT A STATEWIDE PROGRAM IN RACIAL AND ETHNIC  
12 AWARENESS FOR KINDERGARTEN THROUGH GRADE TWELVE (K-12)  
13 TEACHERS AND ADMINISTRATORS; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES."

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## 15 **Subtitle**

16 "AN ACT TO INCREASE THE RACIAL AND ETHNIC SENSITIVITY OF  
17 K-12 TEACHERS AND ADMINISTRATORS IN ARKANSAS PUBLIC  
18 SCHOOLS."

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20 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

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22 SECTION 1. PURPOSE. The General Assembly hereby acknowledges that the  
23 citizens of Arkansas come from diverse racial and ethnic backgrounds and that  
24 the only common meeting ground for many individuals is in the public schools.  
25 It is imperative that the persons charged with administration of the public  
26 schools, with supervision of students in the classroom, and with parent  
27 consultations should be sensitive to racial and ethnic differences among  
28 students, parents, fellow teachers, and administrators. Therefore, the  
29 purpose of this act is to serve as a mandate to the public schools of Arkansas  
30 to increase the racial and ethnic sensitivity of all certified personnel.

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32 SECTION 2. (a) The State Board of Education is hereby authorized and  
33 directed to develop, in cooperation with the Arkansas Black History Advisory  
34 Committee, an inclusive statewide program to increase the racial and ethnic  
35 sensitivity of teachers and administrators in the public schools of this

1 state.

2               (b) The program shall be implemented during the 1993-94 school year,  
3 contingent upon the availability of state staff development funds for this  
4 purpose, and shall serve to assist teachers and administrators in developing a  
5 greater awareness of ethnic and racial differences, improving interpersonal  
6 skills, and enhancing racial harmony.

7               (c) Participating schools and school districts shall permit their  
8 teachers and administrators who have received training in the program to  
9 assist in training other teachers and administrators.

10               (d) Colleges and universities are hereby encouraged to work with  
11 neighboring local school districts regarding professional development of  
12 racial and ethnic awareness.

13               (e) Records shall be kept of the activities authorized by this act and  
14 the Department of Education shall report to the Joint Interim Committee on  
15 Education, no later than October 15, 1994, the status and impact of this  
16 program on the public schools.

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18 SECTION 3. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature  
19 are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code  
20 Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

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22 SECTION 4. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to  
23 any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect  
24 other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without  
25 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this  
26 act are declared to be severable.

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28 SECTION 5. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are  
29 hereby repealed.
