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## 7 **For An Act To Be Entitled**

8 "AN ACT TO AMEND ARKANSAS CODE 10-3-301 (a), 10-3-403 (a),  
9 AND 10-3-502 (b) CONCERNING THE USE OF CONGRESSIONAL  
10 DISTRICTS IN THE SELECTION OF HOUSE MEMBERS TO THE  
11 LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL, LEGISLATIVE JOINT AUDITING COMMITTEE  
12 AND THE JOINT BUDGET COMMITTEE; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES."

14 **Subtitle**

15 "AN ACT CONCERNING THE SELECTION OF HOUSE MEMBERS TO THE  
16 LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL, LEGISLATIVE JOINT AUDITING COMMITTEE  
17 AND THE JOINT BUDGET COMMITTEE."

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19 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

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21 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code 10-3-301 (a) is amended to read as follows:  
22 "(a) An ad interim committee of the General Assembly is hereby  
23 established as a Legislative Council, which shall consist of thirty-six (36)  
24 members to be selected as follows:

25 (1) The Senate of the General Assembly shall select sometime  
26 before adjournment of each regular session twelve (12) members, with three (3)  
27 members to be chosen from each of the four (4) congressional districts of the  
28 state in effect on January 1, 1987, by caucus of the members of the Senate  
29 residing in their respective congressional districts;

30 (2) The House of Representatives of the General Assembly shall  
31 select sometime before adjournment of each regular session twenty (20)  
32 members, with five (5) members to be chosen from each of the four (4)  
33 congressional districts in effect on January 1, 1993, by caucus of the members  
34 of the House of Representatives in their respective congressional districts.  
35 The congressional district of a member of the House of Representatives shall

1 be the district in which he resides unless the member elects to designate as  
2 his congressional district the congressional district in which a majority of  
3 the people in his district resides. However, no more than one (1) member  
4 shall reside in the same county;

5 (3) The President Pro Tempore of the Senate, the Speaker of the  
6 House of Representatives, and the Chairman and Vice-Chairman of the  
7 Legislative Joint Auditing Committee shall be ex officio members of the  
8 Legislative Council and shall enjoy the same rights and privileges as other  
9 council members;

10 (4) Each member of the House of Representatives who was serving  
11 as an at large member of the Council on January 1, 1987, shall continue to  
12 serve as an at large member until he or she resigns that position or ceases to  
13 be a member of the House of Representatives or until a majority of the members  
14 of the House vote against his or her continuance in that position; after  
15 which, the at large position formerly held by the person shall be a district  
16 position and shall be filled by caucus of House members from the appropriate  
17 congressional district. So long as one (1) or more of the at large members of  
18 the Council continue to serve as at large members, the number of members to be  
19 selected by caucus in each of the four (4) congressional districts shall be  
20 reduced by the number of at large members on the Council residing in each of  
21 the congressional districts."

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23 SECTION 2. Arkansas Code 10-3-403 (a) is amended to read as follows:

24 "(a) The Legislative Joint Auditing Committee shall consist of  
25 thirty-six (36) members of the General Assembly, to be selected as follows:

26 (1) Sometime before adjournment of each regular session, the Senate  
27 shall select twelve (12) members, with three (3) to be chosen from each of the  
28 four (4) congressional districts in effect on January 1, 1987, by caucus of  
29 the Senators residing in the respective congressional districts.

30 (2) Sometime before adjournment of each regular session, the House of  
31 Representatives shall select twenty (20) members, with five (5) members to be  
32 chosen from each of the congressional districts in effect on January 1, 1993.

33 The congressional district of a member of the House of Representatives shall  
34 be the district in which he resides unless the member elects to designate as  
35 his congressional district the congressional district in which a majority of

1 the people in his district resides. However, no more than two (2) members  
2 shall reside within the same county.

3 (3) The Speaker of the House, the President Pro Tempore of the Senate,  
4 and the Chairman and Vice-Chairman of the Arkansas Legislative Council shall  
5 be ex officio members of the committee and shall enjoy all the rights and  
6 privileges of other members of the committee.

7 (4) Each member of the House of Representatives who was serving as an  
8 at large member of the committee on January 1, 1987, shall continue to serve  
9 as an at large member until he or she resigns that position or ceases to be a  
10 member of the House of Representatives or until the majority of the members of  
11 the House vote against his or her continuance in the position; after which,  
12 the at large position formerly held by such person shall be a district  
13 position and shall be filled by caucus of House members from the appropriate  
14 congressional district. As long as one (1) or more of the at large House  
15 members of the committee continues to serve the number of congressional  
16 district positions in each district shall be reduced by the number of at large  
17 members residing in the district."

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19 SECTION 3. Arkansas Code 10-3-502 (b) is amended to read as follows:

20 "(b) The House members shall be selected as follows: Five (5) members  
21 from each congressional district as they exist on January 1, 1993, to be  
22 selected by caucus of the House members residing within the district.  
23 Furthermore, the House members of each congressional district shall select two  
24 (2) alternates for the five (5) members selected from the congressional  
25 district. The congressional district of a member of the House of  
26 Representatives shall be the district in which he resides unless the member  
27 elects to designate as his congressional district the congressional district  
28 in which a majority of the people in his district resides."

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30 SECTION 4. For the purposes of Arkansas Code §10-3-301, §10-3-403, and  
31 §10-3-502, a member of the House of Representatives shall only make one (1)  
32 designation on his congressional district. The designation shall be effective  
33 until the next apportionment of the districts of the House of Representatives  
34 or until the member ceases to serve. The designation shall be in writing and  
35 shall be filed with the Speaker of the House.

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2        SECTION 5. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent  
3 nature are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas  
4 Code Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

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6        SECTION 6. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to  
7 any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect  
8 other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without  
9 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this  
10 act are declared to be severable.

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12        SECTION 7. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are  
13 hereby repealed.

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15        SECTION 8. EMERGENCY. It is hereby found and determined by the General  
16 Assembly that this act affects the method of selection of members of the House  
17 of Representatives to the Legislative Council, Legislative Joint Auditing  
18 Committee and the Joint Budget Committee; and that this act is immediately  
19 necessary to provide for the proper selection of such members during the  
20 Seventy-Ninth General Assembly. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to  
21 exist and this act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the  
22 public peace, health and safety shall be in full force and effect from and  
23 after its passage and approval.

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
