8 "AN ACT TO CREATE THE ARKANSAS PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION
9 COORDINATING COUNCIL; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES."

12 "AN ACT TO CREATE THE ARKANSAS PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION
13 COORDINATING COUNCIL."

15 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

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17 SECTION 1. This act may be known and may be cited as the "Arkansas
18 Public Transportation Coordination Act."

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20 SECTION 2. Adequate and efficient public transportation is essential to
21 the well-being of many of our State's citizens and the economic growth of both
22 urban and rural areas. It is the purpose and intent of this act to have a
23 general public transportation policy which encourages the planning,
24 development, implementation, operation, and evaluation of efficient and
25 coordinated transportation systems, both public and private. While the
26 leadership and coordination in the development of public transportation policy
27 and programs is vested in the Arkansas State Highway and Transportation
28 Department by statutory authority, a number of departments, agencies and other
29 legally constituted bodies are involved in the implementation and operation of
30 public transportation services and such policy and programs should be
31 developed with their advice and recommendations.

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33 SECTION 3. There is hereby established the Arkansas Public
34 Transportation Coordination Council which shall consist of eleven (11)
35 members. The members shall be as follows:

1 (1) There shall be three (3) members of the Council appointed by the
2 Governor to serve for terms of four (4) years. One (1) member shall be
3 appointed to represent the transit operators, and shall be directly involved
4 with the management of a public transit system. One (1) member shall be
5 appointed to represent the consumers of public transportation services. One
6 (1) member shall be appointed as a member-at-large. In the event of a vacancy
7 on the Council of one (1) of the gubernatorial positions due to death,
8 resignation, or other reason, the vacancy shall be filled for the unexpired
9 portion of the term by appointment of the Governor of a person meeting the
10 same qualifications required for the initial appointment.

11 (2) There shall be two (2) legislative members of the Council. One (1)
12 shall be a member of the Arkansas Senate and one shall be a member of the
13 House of Representatives and shall be appointed by and shall serve at the
14 pleasure of the President Pro Tempore and the Speaker of the House,
15 respectively.

16 (3) The remaining six (6) members of the Council shall be the Director
17 of the Department of Human Services or his designee; the Director of the
18 Arkansas State Highway and Transportation Department or his designee; the
19 Director of the Arkansas State Health Department or his designee; the Director
20 of the Arkansas Industrial Development Commission or his designee; the
21 Director of the Office of Rural Advocacy or his designee; and the Director of
22 the University of Arkansas Cooperative Extension Service or his designee.

23 (4) The Director of the Arkansas State Highway and Transportation
24 Department or his designee shall serve as chair. The Council shall elect by
25 majority vote one (1) of the non-legislative members to serve as vice-chair.

26 (5) The Council shall have the power to prescribe and issue pursuant to
27 the Arkansas Administrative Procedure Act, Arkansas Code 25-15-201 et seq.,
28 such reasonable rules and regulations as may be necessary to carry out the
29 provisions of this act.

30 (6) The gubernatorial members of the Council shall serve without
31 compensation, provided that, in the event funds shall be available for such
32 purposes, the members may be entitled to receive reimbursement for their
33 actual and necessary expenses in attending Council meetings at a rate not to
34 exceed the maximum established by law or regulation for travel by state
35 employees. The legislative members shall receive, in lieu of reimbursement

1 for meals, lodging, and travel, the same per diem and mileage allowance for
2 each day of attending meetings of the Council as is authorized by law for
3 attending meetings of the joint interim committees of the General Assembly and
4 shall be paid from funds appropriated for that purpose.

5 (7) The Council shall meet at least quarterly, or more frequently at
6 the call of the chair. Six (6) members of the Council constitute a quorum,
7 and a majority vote of the members present is necessary for any action taken
8 by the Council.

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10 SECTION 4. As used in this act, unless the context otherwise requires:

11 (1) "Coordination" means the arrangement for the provision of
12 transportation to the general public in a manner that is cost-effective,
13 efficient, and reduces fragmentation and duplication of services.

14 (2) "Public transportation" means every conveyance of human passengers
15 by bus, van or any other ground surface vehicle which is provided to the
16 general public, or selected groups thereof, on a regular or continuing basis.

17 (3) "Transportation disadvantaged" means those persons who because of
18 physical or mental disability, income status, or age are unable to transport
19 themselves, therefore dependent upon others for transportation services.

20 (4) "Department" means the Arkansas State Highway and Transportation
21 Department.

22 (5) "Council" means the Arkansas Public Transportation Coordinating
23 Council.

24 (6) "Federal agency" means any department, office, council, or agency
25 of the federal government.

26 (7) "State agency" means any department, board, commission, office, or
27 agency of the State of Arkansas.

28 (8) "Local agency" means any entity of a city, town, municipality,
29 county, or other local governing body or a private nonprofit transportation
30 service-providing agency.

31 (9) "State" means the State of Arkansas.

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33 SECTION 5. Administrative support shall be provided by the Arkansas
34 State Highway and Transportation Department. The Department shall employ such
35 personnel as may be necessary to perform adequately the functions of the

1 Council within the limitations of the Department_s biennial appropriations
2 act. The Department may utilize any state appropriated funds or federal funds
3 available for such purposes.

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5 SECTION 6. The Arkansas Public Transportation Coordinating Council, by
6 and through the Arkansas State Highway and Transportation Department, is to
7 accomplish the coordination of transportation services provided to the general
8 public, particularly the transportation disadvantaged. The goal of this
9 coordination shall be to assure the cost-effective provision of public
10 transportation by qualified transportation operators. In carrying out this
11 purpose, the Council shall:

12 (1) Serve as a clearinghouse for information relating to public
13 transportation services, funding sources, innovations, and coordination
14 efforts.

15 (2) Establish statewide objectives for providing public transportation
16 services for the general public, particularly the transportation
17 disadvantaged.

18 (3) Develop policies and procedures for the coordination of federal,
19 state, and local funding for public transportation facilities and services.

20 (4) Identify barriers prohibiting the coordination and accessibility of
21 public transportation services and aggressively pursue the elimination of
22 these barriers.

23 (5) Assist communities in developing public transportation systems
24 available for public use with special emphasis on serving the transportation
25 disadvantaged.

26 (6) Assure that all procedures, guidelines, and directives issued by
27 state agencies are conducive to the coordination of public transportation
28 services and facilities.

29 (7) Develop standards covering coordination, operation, costs, and
30 utilization of public transportation services.

31 (8) Through the Arkansas State Highway and Transportation Department,
32 have the authority to apply for and accept funds, grants, gifts, and services
33 from federal, state, local, or private funding sources. Funds acquired or
34 accepted under this subsection shall be solely for the purpose of carrying out
35 the Council_s responsibilities.

1 (9) Review, monitor, and coordinate all funding requests for state and
2 federal grants to be used for the provision of public transportation services.
3 Such funds shall be available only to those entities participating in an
4 approved coordinated transportation system or entity which have been granted a
5 waiver by the Council.

6 (10) Coordinate all public transportation programs with the appropriate
7 local, state, and federal agencies and public transit agencies to ensure
8 compatibility with existing transportation systems.

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10 SECTION 7. To implement the highest level of interagency cooperation,
11 each State agency, whose functions involve the administration of programs
12 which directly or indirectly funds the purchase of public transportation
13 services, equipment, facilities, or supports operating assistance shall be
14 required to issue policies advocating support for coordinated public
15 transportation and the recommendations coming forth from the Council. Each
16 State agency which is requested by the Council to submit information necessary
17 to carry out the purpose of this act shall do so in a cooperative and timely
18 manner.

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20 SECTION 8. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature
21 are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code
22 Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

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24 SECTION 9. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to
25 any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect
26 other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without
27 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this
28 act are declared to be severable.

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30 SECTION 10. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are
31 hereby repealed.

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
