**HOUSE BILL**

## For An Act To Be Entitled

8 "AN ACT TO MAKE AN APPROPRIATION FOR PERSONAL SERVICES AND  
9 OPERATING EXPENSES FOR RICH MOUNTAIN COMMUNITY COLLEGE FOR  
10 THE BIENNIAL PERIOD ENDING JUNE 30, 1995; AND FOR OTHER  
11 PURPOSES."

## Subtitle

14 "AN ACT FOR RICH MOUNTAIN COMMUNITY COLLEGE  
15 APPROPRIATION."

17 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

19 SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES. There is hereby established for Rich  
20 Mountain Community College for the 1993-95 biennium, the following maximum  
21 number of regular employees whose salaries shall be governed by the provisions  
22 of the Uniform Classification and Compensation Act (Arkansas Code §§21-5-201  
23 et seq.), or its successor, and all laws amendatory thereto. Provided,  
24 however, that any position to which a specific maximum annual salary is set  
25 out herein in dollars, shall be exempt from the provisions of said Uniform  
26 Classification and Compensation Act. All persons occupying positions  
27 authorized herein are hereby governed by the provisions of the Regular  
28 Salaries Procedures and Restrictions Act (Arkansas Code §21-5-101), or its  
29 successor.

27 SECTION 2. EXTRA HELP. There is hereby authorized, for Rich  
28 Mountain Community College for the 1993-95 biennium, the following maximum  
29 number of part-time or temporary employees, to be known as "Extra Help",  
30 payable from funds appropriated herein for such purposes: twenty-four (24)  
31 temporary or part-time employees, when needed, at rates of pay not to exceed  
32 those provided in the Uniform Classification and Compensation Act, or its  
33 successor, or this act for the appropriate classification.

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35 SECTION 3. APPROPRIATIONS - GENERAL REVENUE. There is hereby

1 appropriated, to Rich Mountain Community College, to be payable from the Rich  
2 Mountain Community College Fund, for personal services and operating expenses  
3 of Rich Mountain Community College for the biennial period ending June 30,

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7 SECTION 5. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds

8 authorized by this Act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency

9 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and

10 the restrictions of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and

11 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary

12 Procedures and Restrictions Act, the Higher Education Expenditure Restrictions

13 Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this State, where

14 applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of Finance and

15 Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied with in

16 disbursement of said funds.

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18 SECTION 6. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General

19 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations

20 contained in this Act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which

21 this Act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive

22 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget

23 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or

24 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative

25 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

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27 SECTION 7. CODE. All provisions of this Act of a general and permanent

28 nature are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas

29 Code Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

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31 SECTION 8. SEVERABILITY. If any provision of this Act or the

32 application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such

33 invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the Act which

34 can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this

35 end the provisions of this Act are declared to be severable.

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SECTION 9. GENERAL REPEALER. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are hereby repealed.

SECTION 10. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is hereby found and determined by the Seventy-Ninth General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 1993 is essential to the operation of the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 1993 could work irreparable harm upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 1993.

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
