**HOUSE BILL 1960**

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7 **For An Act To Be Entitled**

8 "AN ACT TO AMEND ARKANSAS CODE TITLE 5, CHAPTER 55,  
9 PERTAINING TO MEDICAID FRAUD; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES."

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11 **Subtitle**

12 "AN ACT PROVIDING A REWARD FOR THE DETECTION AND  
13 PUNISHMENT OF MEDICAID FRAUD."

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15 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

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17 SECTION 1. Subchapter 1 of Chapter 55 of Title 5 of Arkansas Code is  
18 amended by inserting an additional section at the end thereof to read as  
19 follows:

20 "Reward for the detection and punishment of Medicaid fraud.

21 (a) The court is authorized to pay a person such sums, not exceeding  
22 ten percent (10%) of the aggregate penalty recovered, or in any case not more  
23 than one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000), as it may deem just for  
24 information such person may have provided which led to the detecting and  
25 bringing to trial and punishment persons guilty of violating the Medicaid  
26 fraud laws.

27 (1) Upon the disposition of any criminal action relating to  
28 violations of this chapter in which a penalty is recovered, the Attorney  
29 General may petition the court on behalf of a person who may have provided  
30 information which led to the detecting and bringing to trial and punishment  
31 persons guilty of Medicaid fraud to award such person in an amount  
32 commensurate with the quality and usefulness of information determined by the  
33 court to have been provided, in accordance with requirements of this chapter.

34 (2) If the Attorney General elects not to petition the court on  
35 behalf of such person, he may petition the court on his own behalf.

1                   (3) *Neither the state nor any defendant within the action shall  
2 be liable for expenses which a person incurs in bringing an action under this  
3 section.*

4                   (4) *Employees or fiscal agents charged with the duty of referring  
5 or investigating cases of Medicaid fraud who are employed by or contract with  
6 any governmental entity shall not be eligible to receive a reward under this  
7 subsection."*

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9                 SECTION 2. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature  
10 are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code  
11 Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

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13                 SECTION 3. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to  
14 any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect  
15 other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without  
16 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this  
17 act are declared to be severable.

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19                 SECTION 4. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are  
20 hereby repealed.

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22                 SECTION 5. EMERGENCY. It is hereby found and determined by the General  
23 Assembly that the Attorney General and the prosecuting attorneys are in need  
24 of specific legislation by which to eliminate fraud in the Arkansas Medicaid  
25 Program and that immediate passage of this act is necessary to protect the  
26 integrity of the program. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist  
27 and this act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public  
28 peace, health and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after its  
29 passage and approval.
