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HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

7 REQUESTING THE ARKANSAS CONGRESSIONAL DELEGATION AND THE
8 PRESIDENT TO SUPPORT A PROGRAM IN WHICH THE FEDERAL
9 GOVERNMENT WOULD PROVIDE CONTRIBUTIONS TO THE STATES IN
10 THE FORM OF 90/10 FUNDING FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF AN
11 ELECTRONIC BENEFIT TRANSFER (EBT) SYSTEM TO PROCESS FOOD
12 STAMP BENEFITS AS WELL AS INCENTIVES TO STATES TO
13 IMPLEMENT THE SYSTEM.

16 REQUESTING THE CONGRESSIONAL DELEGATION AND THE PRESIDENT
17 TO PROVIDE SUPPORT TO STATES AS INCENTIVE TO AN IMPLEMENT
18 ELECTRONIC BENEFIT SYSTEM.

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20 WHEREAS, an on-line Electronic Benefit Transfer System allows Food Stamp
21 benefits to be stored in a central computer database and electronically
22 accessed by households at the point-of-sale via reusable plastic cards; and

23 WHEREAS, an EBT system allows for greater accountability and monitoring;
24 and

25 WHEREAS, an EBT system reduces the federal cost in coupon printing,
26 shipping, monitoring, and auditing; and

27 WHEREAS, an EBT system eliminates costly mail losses; and

28 WHEREAS, an EBT system results in the removal of coupons as an
29 alternative currency and therefore reduces the abuses due to trafficking in
30 coupons and misdirecting benefits; and

31 WHEREAS, this is the only Medicaid program in which the federal
32 government has not provided 90/10 funding for start-up cost,

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34 NOW THEREFORE,

1 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE SEVENTY-NINTH GENERAL
2 ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:

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4 THAT the General Assembly of the State of Arkansas respectfully urges
5 the Arkansas Congressional Delegation and the President support a program in
6 which the federal government would provide contributions to the states in the
7 form of 90/10 funding for implementation of an Electronic Benefit Transfer
8 (EBT) System to process food stamp benefits as well as incentives to states to
9 implement the systems.

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
