11 PROFESSIONALS AND OTHER NON-PHYSICIAN HEALTH CARE  
12 PROVIDERS AND MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE EIGHTIETH (80TH)  
13 GENERAL ASSEMBLY REGARDING ANY STATUTORY PROVISIONS WHICH  
14 MIGHT IMPROVE HEALTH CARE IN RURAL ARKANSAS.

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17 REQUESTING THE JOINT INTERIM COMMITTEE ON PUBLIC HEALTH,

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21 WHEREAS, there is a severe shortage of health care professionals in many  
22 rural areas of the state; and

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24 WHEREAS, many states have found that broadening the powers of non-  
25 physician health care providers improves access to health care in rural areas;  
26 and

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28 WHEREAS, this concept directly impacts the health of Arkansas citizens  
29 and requires careful study of all the factors before any recommendations are  
30 made,

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32 NOW THEREFORE,

33 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE SEVENTY-NINTH GENERAL  
34 ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:

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1            THAT the Joint Interim Committee on Public Health, Welfare and Labor  
2 study the prescriptive authority of nurse practitioners, physician\_s  
3 assistants, allied health professionals and other non-physician health care  
4 providers and make recommendations to the Eightieth (80th) General Assembly  
5 regarding any statutory provisions which might improve health care in rural  
6 Arkansas.

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
