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## **HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION**

7 REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES TO PURSUE THE  
8 USE OF FILL-THE-GAP BUDGETING AND SOCIAL CONTRACTS FOR  
9 RECIPIENTS OF BENEFITS UNDER THE AID TO FAMILIES WITH  
10 DEPENDENT CHILDREN.

### **Subtitle**

12 REQUESTING DHS TO PURSUE FILL-THE-GAP BUDGETING AND SOCIAL  
13 CONTRACTS FOR AFDC RECIPIENTS.

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15 WHEREAS, the General Assembly finds that encouraging recipients of  
16 benefits under the Aid to Families with Dependent Children program to work and  
17 become self-sufficient will help break the poverty cycle;

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19 WHEREAS, it is necessary to have transitional programs to help bridge  
20 the gap between dependence on public assistance and self-sufficiency;

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22 WHEREAS, Fill-the-Gap Budgeting and Social Contracts are two (2) such  
23 programs;

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25 WHEREAS, Fill-the-Gap Budgeting enhances the state's ability to provide  
26 income support, health care assistance and child care assistance for working  
27 poor families with children by reducing work penalties and ensuring the  
28 availability of Medicaid and child care during the transition period; and

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30 WHEREAS, a Social Contract program promotes independence of public  
31 assistance families by offering opportunities for recipients to increase their  
32 skills, self-esteem and visibility in the marketplace by working, performing  
33 community service hours and attending education and job training programs,

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2 NOW THEREFORE,

3 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE SEVENTY-NINTH GENERAL  
4 ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:

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6 THAT it is therefore declared to be the legislative intent and policy of  
7 this state to require the development of programs that will assist recipients  
8 of benefits under the Aid to Families with Dependent Children program in  
9 making a successful transition to a self-sufficient lifestyle independent of  
10 public assistance.

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12 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the Department of Human Services shall  
13 pursue the use of Fill-the-Gap Budgeting for recipients of benefits under the  
14 Aid to Families with Dependent Children program. "Fill-the-Gap Budgeting"  
15 means programs designed to help public assistance families decrease the  
16 difference between the amount of public assistance the family actually  
17 receives and the family's standard of need without decreasing public  
18 assistance benefits.

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20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the Department of Human Services shall  
21 develop a social contract for recipients of benefits under the Aid to Families  
22 with Dependent Children program. The contract may include, but shall not be  
23 limited to, provisions that require recipients:

- 24 (1) To work a certain number of hours each week;  
25 (2) To perform community service hours;  
26 (3) Attend educational programs; or  
27 (4) Participate in job training programs.

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29 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the Department of Human Services shall  
30 develop a system of day care for children of adult recipients participating in  
31 programs under the social contract if funds are appropriated therefor.

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33 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the Department of Human Services shall  
34 report on the development of programs under this act to the Joint Interim  
35 Committee on Public Health, Welfare and Labor at least quarterly beginning
