8 REQUESTING THE JOINT INTERIM COMMITTEE ON CHILDREN AND
9 YOUTH TO CONDUCT A STUDY REGARDING THE OUT-OF-STATE
10 PLACEMENT FOR TREATMENT OF EMOTIONALLY DISTURBED CHILDREN
11 TO DETERMINE IF THE CHILDREN ARE BEING PLACED
12 APPROPRIATELY.

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Subtitle

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15 REQUESTING A STUDY REGARDING THE OUT-OF-STATE PLACEMENT OF
16 EMOTIONALLY DISTURBED CHILDREN FOR TREATMENT.

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18 WHEREAS, in 1992, approximately one hundred eighty-two (182) emotionally
19 disturbed children from Arkansas received treatment in out-of-state facilities
20 for a total of nine thousand eight hundred ninety-eight (9,898) patient days;
21 and

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23 WHEREAS, there are currently fifteen (15) emotionally disturbed children
24 from Arkansas placed for treatment in facilities in California; and

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26 WHEREAS, in certain areas of the state, a higher number of these
27 children are placed out-of-state; and

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29 WHEREAS, the number of emotionally disturbed children placed out-of-
30 state for treatment has risen significantly in the past few years; and

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32 WHEREAS, Arkansas Code Annotated 20-46-106 states that it is the intent
33 of the Legislature that out-of-state placements for emotionally disturbed
34 children only be considered only in the event that all other alternatives have
35 been exhausted; and

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2 WHEREAS, the state has a responsibility to ensure that these children
3 are appropriately placed for treatment, especially since the Medicaid program
4 is involved;

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6 NOW THEREFORE,

7 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE SEVENTY-NINTH GENERAL
8 ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

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10 That the Joint Interim Committee is requested to conduct a study
11 regarding the out of state placement for treatment of emotionally disturbed
12 children to determine if these children are being appropriately placed. The
13 study shall address the following:

14 (1) The reasons the children are being placed out-of-state;

15 (2) The adequacy and availability of appropriate services within the
16 state;

17 (3) The persons or entities referring the children out-of-state for
18 treatment and the motivation for such referrals;

19 (4) The impact of out of state placement on the well-being of the
20 child; and

21 (5) The difference in cost to the Medicaid program between in-state
22 placements and out-of-state placements.

23 If the study reveals any problems, recommendations should be developed
24 to correct the problems in order to ensure that Arkansas _ emotionally
25 disturbed children are receiving the best treatment possible at a cost which
26 is reasonable to the state.
