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7 **SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION**

8 TO STUDY THE FEASIBILITY OF ESTABLISHING AN OCCUPATIONAL

10 OCCUPATIONAL SAFETY AND HEALTH PROGRAM FOR PUBLIC SECTOR  
11 EMPLOYEES.

14 FOR A STUDY OF THE FEASIBILITY OF ESTABLISHING AN  
15 OCCUPATIONAL SAFETY AND HEALTH PROGRAM FOR PUBLIC  
16 EMPLOYEES.

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18 WHEREAS, public employees of the State of Arkansas and its political  
19 subdivisions are not subject to the occupational safety and health regulations  
20 of the United States Department of Labor, Occupational Safety and Health  
21 Administration (OSHA); and

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23 WHEREAS, public employees in Arkansas do not have the same degree of  
24 protection from occupational exposure to safety and health risks as provided  
25 to most private sector employees; and

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27 WHEREAS, the United States Department of Labor has requested the  
28 assistance of the State of Arkansas in minimizing the health risks to public  
29 sector workers exposed to blood-borne pathogens; and

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31 WHEREAS, twenty-seven (27) states have OSHA-approved plans covering  
32 public sector employees and receive federal grant money for the operation of  
33 their public sector occupational safety and health programs; and

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35 WHEREAS, Arkansas does not have an OSHA-approved state plan for public

1 sector employees and thus does not qualify for a federal grant for its public  
2 sector occupational safety and health program,

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5 NOW THEREFORE,

6 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE SEVENTY-NINTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE  
7 STATE OF ARKANSAS, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN:

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9        THAT the Joint Interim Committee on Public Health, Welfare and Labor is  
10 requested to make a study to determine the feasibility of establishing a  
11 comprehensive OSHA-approved occupational safety and health program for the  
12 public sector in the State of Arkansas.

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14        BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the committee is requested to report its  
15 findings and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the  
16 Eightieth General Assembly.

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
