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## **SENATE RESOLUTION**

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8 ESTABLISHING AN INDUSTRY AND LABOR COMMISSION TO MAKE  
9 RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE ARKANSAS DEPARTMENT OF LABOR  
10 CONCERNING SAFETY CODE NO. 11.

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### **Subtitle**

12 COMMISSION ON ARKANSAS DEPARTMENT OF LABOR SAFETY CODE NO.  
13 11.

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15 WHEREAS, the Arkansas Department of Labor promulgated Safety Code No. 11  
16 for construction and maintenance of electrical transmission and distribution  
17 facilities on February 25, 1963, over thirty (30) years ago; and

18 WHEREAS, since its promulgation no updating amendments or changes have  
19 been made to Safety Code No. 11; and

20 WHEREAS, since the promulgation of Safety Code No. 11, many safety  
21 improvements have been made in the areas of (1) new technology, (2) equipment  
22 and (3) practices, procedures and methods of operation; and

23 WHEREAS, since promulgation of Safety Code No. 11, the Federal

24 Occupation of Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) has asserted  
25 jurisdiction over the construction and maintenance of electrical transmission  
26 and distribution facilities and has promulgated regulations concerning work  
27 thereon; and

28 WHEREAS, there has arisen a dispute concerning the interpretation of  
29 Safety Code No. 11 which if not resolved may result in litigation against the  
30 Arkansas Department of Labor; and

31 WHEREAS, the safety practices of states surrounding Arkansas with regard  
32 to the construction and maintenance of electrical transmission and  
33 distribution facilities varies significantly from the safety practices on such  
34 facilities in the State of Arkansas;

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2 NOW THEREFORE,

3 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE SEVENTY-NINTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE  
4 STATE OF ARKANSAS:

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6 That, an Industry and Labor Commission is hereby established, the make  
7 up of the commission being as follows:

8 1. An invitation to have an industry representative on the commission  
9 shall be extended to each of the following electrical utilities: Arkansas  
10 Power & Light Company, Southwestern Electric Power Company, Oklahoma Gas and  
11 Electric, Arkansas Electric Cooperative Corporation, and a municipal utility  
12 selected by the Arkansas Municipal Power Association. Each utility electing  
13 to participate on the commission shall designate its industry representative.

14 2. A journeyman or senior lineman who regularly works on the  
15 construction or maintenance of electrical transmission or distribution  
16 facilities from each of the electric utilities which accepts the invitation to  
17 participate on the commission shall be designated as a member of the  
18 commission. If the linemen at the participating utilities are represented by  
19 a labor organization, the labor organization may designate the lineman to sit  
20 on the commission, otherwise the lineman will be selected by the respective  
21 utility.

22 3. In return for accepting an offer to serve on the commission, each  
23 industry representative must confirm that the representatives\_ respective  
24 utility will pay all costs and expenses of its industry representative as well  
25 as its designated lineman (including the lineman\_s regular wages).

26 4. The members of the commission shall elect one (1) of the members to  
27 chair the commission.

28 That, THE COMMISSION SHALL STUDY AND DETERMINE THE FOLLOWING:

29 1. The extent to which current OSHA regulations with regard to the  
30 construction of electrical transmission and distribution facilities preempt or  
31 conflict with Safety Code No. 11.

32 2. The extent to which pending OSHA regulations concerning the  
33 maintenance of electrical transmission and distribution facilities would  
34 preempt or conflict with Safety Code No. 11.

35 3. The Safety Codes and/or practices currently in use in the

1 construction or maintenance of electrical transmission and distribution  
2 facilities in states surrounding Arkansas.

3       4. The extent to which improved technology or work procedures may have  
4 rendered Safety Code No. 11 in any way an obstacle to efficiency with no  
5 appreciable increase in safety.

6       That, the commission shall make a recommendation to the Arkansas  
7 Department of Labor with regard to any proposed changes in Safety Code No. 11  
8 by July 1, 1993, and the term of the commission shall expire on July 31, 1993;  
9 and

10      That, the Arkansas Department of Labor should give due deference to the  
11 recommendations of the commission and respond by issuing a new proposed Safety  
12 Code No. 11 by October 1, 1993.

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
