8 "AN ACT TO AMEND ARKANSAS CODE 7-4-101 TO RECONSTITUTE THE
9 STATE BOARD OF ELECTION COMMISSIONERS; AND FOR OTHER
10 PURPOSES."

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Subtitle

13 "TO RECONSTITUTE THE STATE BOARD OF
14 ELECTION COMMISSIONERS."

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16 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

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18 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code 7-4-101 is amended to read as follows:
19 "7-4-101. State Board of Election Commissioners - Members - Officers -
20 Meetings.

21 (a) The State Board of Election Commissioners shall be composed of the
22 following seven (7) persons, with at least one (1) from each congressional
23 district:

24 (1) The Secretary of State;

25 (2) One (1) person designated by the chairman of the state Democratic
26 Party;

27 (3) One (1) person designated by the chairman of the state Republican
28 Party;

29 (4) One (1) person to be chosen by the President Pro Tempore of the
30 Arkansas Senate;

31 (5) One (1) person to be chosen by the Speaker of the Arkansas House of
32 Representatives;

33 (6) Two (2) persons to be chosen by the Governor, one (1) of whom shall
34 be a county clerk and one of whom shall have served for at least three (3)
35 years as a county election commissioner

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2 (b) The Secretary of State shall serve as chairman and secretary of the
3 board and keep the records of the board.

4 (c) Except for the Secretary of State and the county clerk, no member of
5 the board shall be an elected public official.

6 (d) The term on the board of the elected state official shall be
7 concurrent with the term as public elected officer. The county clerk shall
8 hold the office of county clerk when appointed to the board and shall be
9 removed as a member of the board if not in office. The term on the board of
10 all other board members shall be two (2) years or until their successors are
11 appointed and qualified in the manner provided hereinabove for the initial
12 appointment. No appointive member shall be reappointed for more than one (1)
13 term to succeed himself.

14 (e) The board shall meet at least every three (3) months, and more often
15 if needed, at a time and place which shall be designated by the chairman or
16 upon the call of four (4) or more members. *If the chairman calls a meeting*
17 of the board other than the regular quarterly meeting the chairman shall
18 notify each member by certified mail posted at least fourteen (14) days prior
19 to the meeting. If any meeting other than the regular quarterly meeting is
20 called by at least four (4) members of the board the members calling the
21 meeting shall notify each member by certified mail posted at least fourteen
22 (14) days prior to the meeting. However, the meetings may be chaired and
23 conducted by either the chairman, if present, or a board member designated
24 acting chairman for the meeting by the chairman.

25 (f) The State Board of Election Commissioners may perform the following
26 duties:

27 (1) Publish a plain English " election handbook which addresses the
28 do's and dont's for candidates under Arkansas law;

29 (2) Conduct statewide training for election clerks and judges and county
30 election commissioners;

31 (3) Monitor all election law-related legislation;

32 (4) Conduct investigations of citizen complaints and issue advisory
33 opinions regarding violations of election laws except when the same relates
34 to campaign finance and disclosure laws or is within the jurisdiction of the
35 Arkansas Ethics Commission;

1 (5) To develop procedures for receiving citizen complaints which are
2 referred to in subdivision (f)(4);

3 (6) Establish guidelines for and monitor the qualifications of all
4 election officials; and

5 (7) Formulate, adopt, and promulgate all necessary rules and regulations
6 to assure even and consistent application of fair and orderly election
7 procedures.

8 (g) All election-related questions are to be answered by the Secretary
9 of State's office pursuant to §7-1-106 and shall be consistent and in
10 conformity with any policies, guidelines, or regulations established by the
11 board.

12 (h) The Attorney General shall provide legal assistance to the State
13 Board of Election Commissioners in answering questions regarding election
14 laws."

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16 SECTION 2. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent
17 nature are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas
18 Code Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

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20 SECTION 3. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to
21 any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect
22 other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without
23 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this
24 act are declared to be severable.

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26 SECTION 4. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are
27 hereby repealed.
