 9 SUPPORT FOR VOCATIONAL TECHNICAL EDUCATION TO BE DISBURSED
 10 BY THE DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION AS
 11 DIRECTED BY THE STATE BOARD OF HIGHER EDUCATION AND THE
 12 STATE BOARD OF VOCATIONAL EDUCATION FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF
 13 FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION - DISBURSING OFFICER FOR THE
 14 BIENNIAL PERIOD ENDING JUNE 30, 1997; AND FOR OTHER
 15 PURPOSES."

22 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

24 SECTION 1. APPROPRIATIONS. There is hereby appropriated, to the
 25 Department of Finance and Administration - Disbursing Officer, to be payable
 26 from the Work Force 2000 Development Fund, for additional support for
 27 vocational technical education for the biennial period ending June 30, 1997,

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18 SECTION 2. After the amount to be made available to a technical
19 college, technical institute or comprehensive lifelong learning center has
20 been determined by the State Board of Higher Education or State Board of
21 Vocational Education, as provided by law, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the
22 State shall process the documents necessary so that the funds may be
23 transferred from the Work Force 2000 Development Fund to the State Treasury
24 fund or fund account from which the technical college, technical institute,
25 or comprehensive lifelong learning center draws its general revenue support.

26 The Chief Fiscal Officer of the State shall also cause an equal amount
27 of the appropriation provided in Items (1) and (2) of Section 1 of this Act
28 to be transferred to the institutions' appropriate line item appropriation or
29 allocation, there to be supplemental and in addition to those appropriations
30 or allocations provided by the General Assembly for personal services and
31 operating expenses of the institution from the State Treasury Fund or fund
32 account.

33

34 SECTION 3. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds
35 authorized by this Act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency

1 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and
2 the restrictions of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and
3 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
4 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal
5 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by
6 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be
7 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

9 SECTION 4. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General
10 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations
11 contained in this Act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for
12 which this Act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive
13 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget
14 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or
15 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative
16 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

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18 SECTION 5. CODE. All provisions of this Act of a general and
19 permanent nature are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and
20 the Arkansas Code Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

21

22 SECTION 6. SEVERABILITY. If any provision of this Act or the
23 application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such
24 invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the Act which
25 can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this
26 end the provisions of this Act are declared to be severable.

27

28 SECTION 7. GENERAL REPEALER. All laws and parts of laws in conflict
29 with this Act are hereby repealed.

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31 SECTION 8. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is hereby found and determined by the
32 Eightieth General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas
33 prohibits the appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period;
34 that the effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 1995 is essential to the
35 operation of the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are

1 provided, and that in the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the
2 delay in the effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 1995 could work
3 irreparable harm upon the proper administration and provision of essential
4 governmental programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist
5 and this Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public
6 peace, health and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after
7 July 1, 1995.
