8 "AN ACT TO AMEND ARKANSAS CODE 11-4-210 (a) CONCERNING THE
9 MINIMUM WAGE; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES."

Subtitle

13 "AN ACT CONCERNING THE MINIMUM WAGE."

16 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

18 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code 11-4-210 (a) is amended to read as follows:
19 "(a)(1) Beginning July 1, 1994, every employer shall pay each of his
20 employees wages at the rate of not less than four dollars and twenty-five
21 cents (\$4.25) per hour except as otherwise provided in this chapter.

22 (2) Beginning July 1, 1995, every employer shall pay each of his
23 employees wages at the rate of not less than four dollars and thirty-five
24 cents (\$4.35) per hour except as otherwise provided in this chapter.

25 (3) Beginning July 1, 1996, every employer shall pay each of his
26 employees wages at the rate of not less than four dollars and forty-five
27 cents (\$4.45) per hour except as otherwise provided in this chapter."

28

29 SECTION 2 . All provisions of this act of a general and permanent
30 nature are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas
31 Code Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

32

33 SECTION 3. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to
34 any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect
35 other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without

1 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this
2 act are declared to be severable.

3

4 SECTION 4. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are
5 hereby repealed.

6

7 SECTION 5. EMERGENCY. It is found and determined by the General
8 Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the provisions of this act make
9 changes in the minimum wage as of July 1, 1995; and that to provide for the
10 effective administration of the minimum wage law, this act is immediately
11 necessary. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this act
12 being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health
13 and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and
14 approval.
