HOUSE BILL 1647

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7 For An Act To Be Entitled

8 "AN ACT TO AMEND ARKANSAS CODE ANNOTATED §§ 23-79-141 AND
9 23-79-145 TO MANDATE THE COVERAGE OF CHILDREN'S PREVENTIVE
10 HEALTH CARE IN HEALTH INSURANCE CONTRACTS; AND FOR OTHER
11 PURPOSES."

14 "TO MANDATE THE COVERAGE OF CHILDREN'S
15 PREVENTIVE HEALTH CARE IN HEALTH
16 INSURANCE CONTRACTS."

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18 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

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20 *SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Annotated 23-79-141 is amended to read
21 as follows:*

22 "*23-79-141. Children's Preventive Health Care Act.*

23 (a) *Title. This section shall be known and may be cited as the
24 Children's Preventive Health Care Act.*

25 (b) *Declaration of Purposes. The purpose of this section is to assure
26 that all children eighteen (18) years of age and younger are provided with
27 insurance coverage for preventive health care services during their formative
28 years in order to facilitate early detection and prevention of physical and
29 mental illness; thereby avoiding the risks of the extreme costs associated
30 with many preventable childhood diseases. In addition to improving the
31 health of children, providing insurance coverage for children's preventive
32 health care services enhances the care giving skills of parents and helps
33 strengthen the family unit. Providing insurance coverage for children's
34 preventive health care will also reduce the disruption to the emotional and
35 financial well-being of families that often accompanies physical and mental*

1 illness among children.

2 (c) Definitions. As used in this section:

3 (1) Children's Preventive Health Care Services means
4 physician-delivered or physician-supervised services for eligible dependents
5 from birth through age eighteen (18), with periodic preventive care visits,
6 including medical history, physical examination, developmental assessment,
7 anticipatory guidance and appropriate immunizations and laboratory tests, in
8 keeping with prevailing medical standards for the purposes of this section;

9 (2) Periodic Preventive Care Visits means the routine tests
10 and procedures for the purpose of detection of abnormalities or malfunctions
11 of bodily systems and parts according to accepted medical practice.

12 (d)(1) Applicability. Every disability insurer, hospital or medical
13 service corporation, health maintenance organization, fraternal benefit
14 society, and self-insured plan transacting disability insurance or providing
15 disability coverage in this state which delivers, issues for delivery in this
16 state, or renews, extends, or modifies disability policies, contracts,
17 certificates, and plans providing hospital and medical coverage on an expense
18 incurred, service, or prepaid basis, which contracts provide coverage for a
19 family member of the insured person, shall provide to the contract holder
20 coverage for periodic preventive care visits for covered persons from the
21 moment of birth through the age of eighteen (18).

22 (2) This section does not apply to disability income, specified
23 disease, medicare supplement, hospital indemnity, or accident only policies.

24 (e) Coverage. (1) Each disability insurance policy, contract,
25 certificate, or plan providing benefits for children's preventive health care
26 services on a periodic basis shall include twenty (20) visits at
27 approximately the following age intervals: birth, two (2) weeks, two (2)
28 months, four (4) months, six (6) months, nine (9) months, twelve (12) months,
29 fifteen (15) months, eighteen (18) months, two (2) years, three (3) years,
30 four (4) years, five (5) years, six (6) years, eight (8) years, ten (10)
31 years, twelve (12) years, fourteen (14) years, sixteen (16) years, and
32 eighteen (18) years.

33 (2) A disability insurance policy, contract, certificate, or
34 plan may provide that children's preventive health care services which are
35 rendered during a periodic review shall only be covered to the extent that

1 these services are provided by or under the supervision of a single physician
2 during the course of one (1) visit.

3 (f) Reimbursement, Co-Insurance and Deductibles. The benefits which
4 are mandated by this section shall be reimbursed at levels established by the
5 Insurance Commissioner which shall not exceed those established for the same
6 services under the Medicaid program in the State of Arkansas. Benefits for
7 recommended immunization services shall be exempt from any co-payment,
8 coinsurance, deductible or dollar limit provisions in the health insurance
9 policy. This exemption shall be explicitly stated in the policy that all
10 other children_s preventive health care services will be subject to co-
11 payment, coinsurance, deductible, or dollar limit provisions in the health
12 insurance policy."

13 SECTION 2. Arkansas Code Annotated 23-79-145, pertaining to basic
14 health care insurance for children, is repealed.

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16 SECTION 3. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent
17 nature are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas
18 Code Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

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20 SECTION 4. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to
21 any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect
22 other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without
23 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this
24 act are declared to be severable.

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26 SECTION 5. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are
27 hereby repealed.
